- Was either a hostile or non-hostile casualty
- Has a connection to New York City

CONNECTION TO NEW YORK CITY AND VERIFICATION AS POST-9/11 FALLEN SERVICEMEMBER:

- \bigstar
- Born in NYC, Raised in NYC, Resided during or after military service, Worked in NYC, Other (Please specify).
- Proof of NYC Residency
 - Driver's License, State ID, Utility bill, lease showing an NYC Address, Pay Stub, Obituary News Article
- A Hostile and Non-Hostile Casualty is defined as a service member who was KIA, Died of Wounds, Died of Terrorist Activities, Accident, Illness/Injury, Homicide, Self-inflicted and Undetermined.
- Copy of DD214 or other military-issued documents verifying service as a Post-9/11 servicemember deployed in support of the following military operations:
 - Operation Enduring Freedom (OEF) began on October 7, 2001 and officially ended December 31, 2014. OEF operations were predominantly conducted in Afghanistan but also occurred in other regions of the world (e.g., Horn of Africa, Trans Sahara).
 - Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF) began on March 20, 2003 and ended August 31, 2010.
 - Operation New Dawn (OND) began on September 1, 2010 and officially ended on December 15, 2011.
 - Operation Odyssey Dawn (OOD) and NATO's Operation Unified Protector (OUP) began on March 19, 2011 and officially ended on October 31, 2011.
 - Operation Inherent Resolve (OIR) began on October 15, 2014. OIR is a coalition of more than 60 countries that contribute to operations aimed at militarily defeating the terrorists in Iraq and Syria who call themselves the Islamic state.
 - Operation Freedom's Sentinel (OFS) and NATO's Operation Resolute Support (ORS) began on January 1, 2015. OFS and ORS provide training, advice, and assistance to Afghan security institutions in addition to counterterrorism support required to build Afghan security capabilities and long-term, sustainable, stability for the Afghan people.

These documents should indicate that your veteran either: a) was in-country during one of the above operations, or b) received a Service Medal, Campaign Medal, or other award indicating participation in support, etc.

- We cannot accept photographs of medals, pins, patches, or grave markers as proof of service in support of Post 9/11 military operations.
- If you do not have a copy of military documents, military service records can be obtained from the National Archives Veterans Service Records. Visit www.archives.gov and click on "Veterans' Service Records."
