

Supportive Services for Veteran Families

Overview

SSVF programs provide outreach and case management services and assist participants to obtain VA benefits and other public benefits. SSVF services include housing counseling, legal services, benefits advocacy, rental and utility assistance, child care supports, moving and storage costs, and transportation. To receive supportive services under this program, you must be:

- 1. **A member of a Veteran family**: A Veteran family is defined as a single person or a family in which the head of household or the spouse of the head of household is a Veteran.
- 2. **Very low-income**: Households with income that does not exceed 80% of area median income (as adjusted).
