### II. Summary of Veteran Resource Center Services

Veteran Resource Centers provide members of the community with resources and information about crucial social services including, but not limited to housing, City services, mental health information, employment support, and legal assistance. DVS facilitates connections to nonprofit, City, State, and Federal service providers that meet these areas of need. Further, DVS staff members assist Veteran community members with preparing VA claims.

The DVS Claims Unit – trained and accredited by the New York State Division of Veterans’ Services –helps prepare VA claims for Service-Connected Disability, Non-Service-Connected Pension, and G.I. Bill Certificates of Eligibility regarding education.
