CITY UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK (CUNY)

The **City University of New York (cuny.edu)** is the largest urban university system in the country, comprising 25 campuses: eleven senior colleges, seven community colleges, one undergraduate honors college, and seven postgraduate institutions. THE PROJECT FOR RETURN AND OPPORTUNITY IN VETERANS EDUCATION (PROVE)

The Project for Return and Opportunity in Veterans

PROVE offers campus support teams made up of social work interns, student veteran mentors, and experienced field instructors; all of whom work together with existing campus staff to connect new and current student veterans to the resources they need: proveveterans.org

VA EDUCATION BENEFITS:

Accredited DVS staff members represent NYC veterans and their families in claims for benefits from the US Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) – including G.I. Bill education benefits. Schedule an online appointment with a DVS staff member by filling out the form at **VetConnectNYC.org** and selecting Benefits Navigation as your preferred service. DVS can support veterans with the following education benefits:

- The **Post 9/11 GI Bill** provides education benefits for those who have served on active duty for 90 or more days after September 10th, 2001: va.gov/education/about-gi-bill-benefits/post-9-11
- The Forever GI Bill expands eligibility for GI Bill benefits: benefits.va.gov/gibill/forevergibill.asp
- Montgomery GI Bill is available to active-duty members who served at least two years on active duty. You are entitled to this benefit if you're a member of the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps or Coast Guard Reserves, Army National Guard, or Air National Guard, and additional requirements: va.gov/education/about-gi-bill-benefits/montgomery-active-duty

TUITION SUPPORT:

- Veterans Tuition Awards are awarded for full-time and part-time student veterans who are enrolled in an approved program at an undergraduate or graduate college or university or in an approved vocational training program: hesc.ny.gov/pay-for-college/financial-aid/types-of-financial-aid/nys-grants-scholarships-awards/veterans-tuition-awards.html
- The **Yellow Ribbon Program** helps student veterans pay for out-of-state, private school, or graduate school tuition that the Post-9/11 GI Bill doesn't cover: va.gov/education/about-gi-bill-benefits/post-9-11/yellow-ribbon-program
- The **Posse Foundation's** Veteran Program helps select Post-9/11 veterans receive a cost-free bachelor's degree at Vassar College, Wesleyan University, and the University of Virginia: possefoundation.org
- Under Mercy College's Mathematics Education Intensive Residency Program (MEIRPRO) veterans can earn a tuition-free Master of Science degree in Mathematics Education funded by the National Science Foundation: mercy.edu/academics/school-education/mathematics-education-intensive-residency-program-meirpro
- Veterans who hope to become teachers can find resources for funding their education at TeachingDegree.org.

SCHOLARSHIPS

- CUNY SPS U.S. Military Bachelor's Degree Completion Scholarship provides active-duty service members who have college credits with partial financial assistance to help cover the cost of undergraduate studies at the CUNY School of Professional Studies: sps.cuny.edu/about/news/newscholarship-help-cover-school-fees-military-undergrads
- New York State Regents Awards (for Children) provides up to \$450 per year to students whose parent(s) served in the US Armed Forces during specified times of national emergency: hesc.ny.gov/pay-for-college/financial-aid/types-of-financial-aid/nys-grants-scholarships-awards/nys-regents-awards-for-children-of-deceased-and-disabled-veterans.html
- Military Service Recognition Scholarship is available to certain dependents of military personnel who passed away, became permanently disabled, or went missing in combat or in a combat zone of operation since August 2nd, 1990: hesc.ny.gov/pay-for-college/military-corner.html
- **Pat Tillman Foundation Scholarship** is a competitive scholarship open to veterans and spouses with a proven track record of leadership: pattillmanfoundation.org/tillman-scholars-military-scholarships
- Student Veterans of America Partner Scholarships offer competitive scholarships to U.S. Navy student veterans, U.S. Army student veterans, and students studying computer science and related majors: studentveterans.org/programs-events/scholarships
- Sentinels of Freedom Merit Grant is a merit-based scholarship offered to veterans with a VA disability rating of 50% or higher and have been wounded or injured in a combat or training-related event post 9/11: sofapply.smapply.org

VOCATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAMS:

- Veteran Rapid Retraining Assistance Program (VRRAP) offers education and training for highdemand jobs to veterans who are unemployed due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The program covers 12 months of tuition and fees. The program also provides a monthly housing allowance. VRRAP covers education and training programs approved under the GI Bill and Veteran Employment Through Technology Education Courses (VET TEC) that lead to high-demand jobs, including associate degrees, non-college degrees, and certificate programs. The Department of Labor determines what's considered a high-demand job for VRRAP. To be eligible, veterans can not be receiving assistance from the following programs: unemployment, Post 9/11 GI Bill, Montgomery GI Bill, Veteran Readiness and Employment, Survivors' and Dependents' Educational Assistance, Veterans' Educational Assistance Program: va.gov/education/other-va-educationbenefits/veteran-rapid-retraining-assistance
- Veteran Readiness and Employment (VR&E) offers vocational rehabilitation and employment services to veterans with a VA disability rating and an employment handicap: benefits.va.gov/vocrehab
- Affordable Colleges Online provides a comprehensive resource guide for veterans interested in attending vocational and trade schools and includes tools to help veterans find the right school and program: affordablecollegesonline.org/college-resource-center/veteran-vocational-trade-students

VA WORK-STUDY

The **VA Work-Study program** is an opportunity for veterans to get paid for part-time work while they study at a college, vocational, or professional training program. MILITARY TUITION ASSISTANCE

Military Tuition Assistance is a benefit available to eligible members of the Army, Navy, Marines, Air Force, and Coast Guard to help cover tuition and fees at an educational institution. Courses and degree programs may be academic or technical.
