This year's Earth Day theme is "Invest in Our Planet." With that theme in mind, we think it's the perfect time to highlight how much the clean energy industry has invested in our Veterans!

According to the <u>2022 United States Energy and Employment Report</u> issued by the **U.S. Department of Energy**, over **650,000 Veterans** work in the Energy Sector, and within that, Veterans make up **9%** of the entire clean energy workforce.

In the Solar Sector, there are over <u>27,000 military Veterans</u> making up 8% of the workforce, while over <u>10,000 Veterans</u> work in the Wind Sector. According to the **American Clean Power Association**, Veterans are <u>hired 50% and 33%</u> <u>MORE</u> in the wind and solar industries.

Governor Hochul's SNAP Initiative: FreshConnect Fresh2You



In case you skimmed past last week's *Veteran News* section, we wanted to take a moment to highlight **Governor Hochul's** new initiative--*FreshConnect Fresh2You*--which will double the buying power for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) recipients at farmers' markets across New York State. **DVS** is standing by to assist you with your **SNAP application** process.

About Governor Hochul's Initiative

- The FreshConnect Fresh2You initiative will now provide SNAP beneficiaries at participating farmers' markets with \$2 checks for every \$2 spent as part of the SNAP program, up from \$2 for every \$5 spent.
- Allows families in need to purchase more healthy foods, including produce, dairy, and meats, helping to offset recent reductions in SNAP benefits and inflation costs.
- Increases revenue for New York farmers

SNAP Benefits Need-to-Know

What is SNAP?

• The **Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)** provides nutrition benefits to supplement the food budget of families in need so they can purchase healthy food and move towards self-sufficiency. SNAP takes into account a family's overall financial status and provides individualized aid.

How to apply

 Apply online at ACCESS HRA. Visit and download an application from <u>HRA's website</u>. You may also call 311 or HRA's Infoline at 718-557-1399 and someone will send you an application and information on where you can *mail it in*, *fax* or *bring in person*. Also, an authorized representative can file an application for you online, at any Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Center, or at a participating community based organization.

How benefits are determined

 Your benefits package is determined by household size, expenses, and income. Don't be discouraged from applying if you're employed, own a home and/or car, and have money saved; you may still be eligible for benefits!

The Process

• Most applications are **processed within 30 days**, however expedited processing is available and emergency benefits can be distributed within 5 days. To learn more about expedited processing and eligibility, click here.

Those who receive a benefits package will be given an **Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) card** to use at food stores that **accept EBT**.

• Did you know that you can now use your Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits to shop online for fresh produce and groceries? Participating retailers include Amazon, ShopRite, and Walmart!

GOP resolution seeking to halt abortion care at Veterans Affairs fails in the Senate

WASHINGTON — The Democratic-controlled Senate on Wednesday blocked a resolution that sought to halt abortion services provided by the Department of Veterans Affairs.

A motion to proceed to the GOP-sponsored measure, which was introduced by Sen. Tommy Tuberville, R-Ala., failed in a 48-51 vote.

At a news conference before the vote, Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer, D-N.Y., said that Democrats would defend veterans' rights.

"We all know it's up to veterans to step up to protect us," Schumer said. "They risked their lives for us. They're always there for us. And now, when these same

veterans have their health care attacked, Senate Democrats are stepping up to protect their rights." [READ MORE...]

There will also be a Veterans Benefit Coordinator on site to help with claims and benefits.



Financial assistance support for post-9/11 New York veterans and their families

We believe warriors can thrive with access to integrated services focused on their individual and collective well-being.

Critical Needs Program

Hope For the Warriors Critical Needs program serves as a short-term financial bridge for post 9/11 veterans and their families, and for survivors of traumas as they navigate through long-term recovery.

Support includes financial education and financial assistance to help offset income loss due to:

- · Delays in disability claims processing
- Combat related loss of income
- Homelessness and homeless prevention
- · Increased care due to injury progression
- Housing support for veteran to engage in intensive outpatient and/or inpatient psychiatric treatment for PTSD, MST, depression, anxiety, or equivalent mental health diagnoses
- Assistance in the form of financial grants, resource referrals, supportive counseling and financial literacy training

Goal: The Hope Fund for Critical Financial Assistance provides financial relief to all eras of military and Veteran caregivers through a grant that aims to put you and your family on the path to financial wellness. These grants aim to provide high-impact financial assistance to prevent or address a significant crisis or to improve the quality of life of the caregiver family. These grants fill the gaps that other programs may not cover.

Who is eligible for the grant program?

- Adult caregiver, (18 years and older), for a military service member or veteran
- Demonstrates financial assistance need
- Vendor or name of Company is legally able to receive taxable income in the U.S., this includes they're being a citizen, green card holder, and/or permanent resident who can provide a W9 and SSN or (TIN)

Amount: Depending on need, grants will be made on a case-by-case review at the discretion of EDF staff. These are grants that aim to assist with larger needs to put you on a path of financial wellness.


How do you define "financial assistance needs"?

Forensic Mortuary Technician - Forensic Mortuary Technicians oversee the administrative disposition of deceased persons; may supervise and assist a group of City Mortuary Technicians who retrieve and receive deceased persons, and who prepare for and assist in autopsies.

Oiler - Oilers, under direct supervision, are responsible for the lubrication of power plant, pumping and/or construction equipment. They lubricate and clean pumps, engines, blowers, compressors, motors, gears, ejectors, bridge cables and other operating equipment; assist in the operation, maintenance and repair of this equipment; read meters and gauges; keep logs; operate lubricant filtering and purifying equipment; maintain lubricant inventory; and may operate a motor vehicle in the performance of assigned duties.

School Computer Technology Specialist - School Computer Technology Specialists (DOE) perform work related to the instructional and administrative information systems located within a school in the areas of computer maintenance and repair, mainframe, server and/or mini computer operations, software and technical support, and training. School Computer Technology Specialists (DOE) may drive a motor vehicle.
