Get a Discount on your Internet Bill Through the Affordable Connectivity Program!



New Yorkers can now apply for the <u>Affordable Connectivity Program</u> for up to \$30 off their monthly internet bill. Your household may be eligible if someone in the household falls under just one of these criteria:

- If a household income is 200% or less than the federal poverty guideline (ex: at or less than \$35,775 for a household of 4)
- If you or your child or dependent participate in certain government assistance programs such as SNAP, Medicaid, WIC, or other federal benefits programs
- If you or your child or dependent already receives a Lifeline benefit
- If a child in your household attend a NYC public school that participates in the free or reduced lunch program (all NYC public schools do!)
- **Note:** You do **not** need to be a U.S. citizen to be eligible. If you do not have a Social Security Number (SSN), you can provide other documents.
- Note: Additionally, customers are not required to submit to a credit check.
