If you are a Veteran who has become unemployed due to the COVID-19 pandemic, there is a program for you.

The <u>Veteran Rapid Retraining Assistance Program (VRRAP)</u> provides education and training towards an Associate's degree, non-college degree, or certificate that leads to a high-demand job. VRRAP covers education and training courses approved under the <u>G.I. Bill</u> as well as <u>Veteran Employment Through Technology Education Courses (VET TEC)</u> designed to train Veterans for designated high-demand jobs. Eligible Veterans participating in VRRAP can receive up to 12 months of tuition, and monthly housing allowance payments based on Post-9/11 G.I. Bill rates.

Lt. Gen. Michael Langley Makes History as Marines' First Black Four-Star General



On Tuesday evening, August 2, the <u>Senate</u> confirmed Lieutenant General Michael E. Langley to promotion as the <u>Marines</u>' first Black four-star general.

This marks a historic moment for the U.S. Marines; for the first time in its 246-year history, the Marines will have a Black four-star general. Lieutenant General Langley will be leading all U.S. forces in Africa as chief of its Africa Command.

Military officials say the Shreveport, Louisiana native earned his stripes at every level.


Commissioned in 1985, Lieutenant General Langley commanded the <u>Battery K</u>, <u>5th Battalion</u>, and the <u>11th Marine Regiment</u> in support of Operation Wildfire in the Western U.S. <u>The University of Texas at Arlington</u> led at every level - from platoon to regiment.

Lieutenant General Langley, who has served more than 35 years in the U.S. Marine Corps and more recently assumed command of the <u>U.S. Marine Corps</u> Forces Europe and Africa a year ago.


