"Veterans Feeding Veterans" Distributed 1.4 Million Meals Since Partnership Began



Governor Kathy Hochul today celebrated the continued success of an initiative to distribute meals to New York's veterans, service members and their families through a partnership between the New York State Department of Veterans' Services and HelloFresh, the world's leading meal kit delivery company. Initiated to combat food insecurity that was exacerbated during the COVID-19 pandemic, the partnership builds on the successful Nourish New York initiative, a multi-agency effort to reduce food insecurity and support food producers across the state. More than 1.4 million healthy meals have been distributed since the program began, including thousands of meal kits for the Thanksgiving holiday.


This summit offers: an introduction to the legacy of Veterans in America's modern and contemporary art history, an introduction to government and private sector

Second Round of Veterans Non-Profit Capital Program



The Veterans Nonprofit Capital Grant Program overseen by the New York State Department of Veterans' Services and administered by the Dormitory Authority of the State of New York, is a vital initiative dedicated to enhancing and enabling critical upgrades to the facilities of veterans organizations across the state. Following a successful first round with over \$2.5 million distributed, an additional \$2.4 million will be available through a second round of applications.

In this second round of funding, which will open for applications on **November 29**, **2023**, selected organizations will receive reimbursement for costs related to capital improvements, with awards ranging from \$25,000 to \$75,000. This invaluable support will enable these organizations to make critical upgrades, including new roofs, ADA-compliant enhancements, and renovations to common areas and kitchens.

A live presentation to provide interested organizations with information about how to prepare to apply for this funding opportunity was held on Friday, November 17 at 12:00 PM. A recording of the presentation has been made available on the NYS DVS website.

Why the Major Drop in Veteran Homelessness offers hope for others

A homeless person sleeping on America's streets in 2010 was far more likely to be a veteran than today: while the rate of homelessness has remained <u>relatively stagnant</u> in the U.S., it's dropped by about 55% among veterans, from about <u>74,000 in 2010 to 33,129 in 2022</u>. Even more veterans will have a home for the holidays this year: on November 29, the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) <u>announced</u> it had permanently housed nearly 39,000 veterans since the start of the year, surpassing its goal for the entire year.

In an era of soaring inflation, limited housing and high rents, it may seem inevitable that some Americans become homeless, especially given that many experts have <u>found</u> that high housing costs are closely <u>connected to rates of homelessness</u>. However, those who have closely studied how to address <u>American homelessness</u> say that progress among veterans shows that efforts to help people can be remarkably effective if matched to the scale of the crisis. 
