New York City Small Business Service offers a career development program and job board called Workforce1. The program has by appointment only in-person career centers to help you develop your resume, find classes, provide 1-on-1 career counseling, connect you to employers committed to hiring Veterans, and much more. As a Veteran or Veteran Spouse, you receive **Priority1** service which doesn't only mean preferential treatment, but access to resources such as interview attire, rides to interviews, and translation of military experience into the civilian sector.

New York State Division of Veterans' Services Nonprofit Capital Program Request for Grant Applications (RGA)



New York State Division of Veterans' Services is currently accepting applications for the <u>state's newly created Veterans' Nonprofit Capital Program</u> which will provide \$5 million in Grant funds for reimbursement for costs related to capital improvements designed to expand and enhance quality services available to the state's veterans, service members and their families. Funding for projects will range between \$25,000 and \$75,000 and be administered by the New York State Division of Veterans' Services.

Funding through the Veterans' Nonprofit Capital Program is limited to the following: design, construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation or expansion of an eligible facility; purchase of furnishings or equipment for an eligible facility, provided the furnishings or equipment have a useful life of 10 years or more; and certain construction soft costs including architectural, engineering and design. Eligible projects include, but are not limited to, replacing a roof, paving a parking lot, or making a building ADA compliant.

For the purposes of this program, veterans' organizations are defined as any notfor-profit organization doing business in the state, the membership of which consists of individuals who were members of the United States Armed Forces and/or which the main purpose of the organization is to benefit members of the country's Armed Forces.

Applicants are encouraged to submit questions about the Veterans' Nonprofit Capital Program to <u>grants@veterans.ny.gov</u>. Applicants also can find more information on the <u>New York State Grants Gateway</u> website, which must be used to submit the application for funding.

The deadline for applications is March 31, 2023 at 4:00 PM

NYC Civil Service Job Openings and Exams



You served your country. Now serve your city!

Do your part to keep the city running! The <u>NYC Department of Citywide</u> <u>Administrative Services (DCAS)</u> makes City government work for all New Yorkers.

There are many diverse career opportunities with NYC DCAS.

Veterans are no longer required to pay application fees for NYC Civil Service examinations. And Veteran Spouses are now eligible for a one-time application fee waiver for NYC Civil Service examinations.

See below for open competitive NYC Civil Service exam highlights:

Open Competitive Exams

School Safety Agent: School Safety Agents patrol designated areas of school buildings and surrounding areas; identify and prevent infiltration of unlawful or prohibited items through scanning; give routine information to visitors and direct them to the proper personnel and offices; request identification of, and remove from the premises, any unauthorized persons; aid sick and injured persons and call for medical, police or fire assistance, when needed; notify supervisors of all emergency incidents and complete any related documentation; respond to altercations between students and other persons, and attempt to separate the

involved persons and resolve conflicts; maintain records of persons entering and leaving buildings; monitor security camera systems to ensure facility entrances are secure; identify persons violating Department of Education Rules and Regulations; apprehend persons violating the Penal Law and notify the proper administrative personnel; prepare reports and testify in regard to these violations at Superintendent's or Principal's hearings and/or in court; monitor and use radios to request assistance from co-workers; and may operate motor vehicles.
