# First Medal of Honor Recipient from Vietnam War Dies at 89

Roger Donlon, the first American to receive a Medal of Honor for heroism during the Vietnam War, died Thursday in Leavenworth, Kansas, according to the <u>Congressional Medal of Honor Society</u>. He was 89.

Donlon's bravery in Vietnam during the summer of 1964 earned him the decoration, which President Lyndon B. Johnson presented him at the White House in December of that year.

The Special Forces soldier's passing followed a 12-year battle with Parkinson's disease, <u>according to an obituary</u> shared online. Donlon was just five days short of his 90th birthday. [READ MORE...]


