White House \$3.1 bilion homeless program includes help for vets

White House officials are pairing new legal support and job training programs for veterans with a \$3.1 billion investment in general community support grants in an effort to further reduce the <u>number of veterans facing homelessness</u>.

Administration officials unveiled the plans on Thursday, calling them "the single largest investment in communities' homelessness response systems in history." The move comes as <u>Veterans Affairs officials</u> said they are on pace with their goal of <u>permanently housing 38,000 at-risk veterans</u> this year.

"Homelessness is a challenge we face as a nation, but importantly it is also a solvable one," said White House Domestic Policy Advisor Neera Tanden in a press conference on the new initiatives. According to the latest federal estimates, <u>about 33,000 veterans across the country</u> <u>lack reliable, permanent housing</u> on any given day. That figure is down about 11% since 2020 and down about 55% since 2010. [READ MORE]
