USS Cooperstown Commissioning Ceremony



Last Saturday, New York City welcomed the USS Cooperstown into the Navy's fleet of ships. Politicians, Service Members, and Baseball Legends all spoke on the inseparable ties between military service and the game of baseball.

Why Baseball?

In times of national crisis, brave men and women across America nobly sacrifice their occupations and home life to defend their country in the U.S. military. Baseball players are no different. During WWII, hundreds of ballplayers enlisted during their major league careers, many of them bypassing some of their prime

seasons on the diamond. Others joined the armed forces after their playing days came to an end.

Announced in 2015 by then-United States Navy Secretary Ray Mabus, the Navy's 23rd Littoral Combat Ship was named the USS Cooperstown to honor the military Veterans who are members of the National Baseball Hall of Fame.

70 of the 342 elected Hall of Famers interrupted their playing careers to serve in the military, including 27 Navy Veterans. Each of the 70 Veterans, which represents more than 20 percent of all Hall of Famers, is honored with a medallion in the Plaque Gallery that reflects their branch of service.

The Ceremony

The commissioning ceremony marks a ship's entry into active service in the United States Navy. At the moment the commission pennant breaks the masthead, USS COOPERSTOWN will become a Navy command in her own right, and take her place alongside the other active ships of the fleet.

The Motto

The ship's motto, "AMERICA'S AWAY TEAM," evolved from remarks made by then-Secretary of the Navy, The Honorable Ray Mabus. Secretary Mabus expressed that Sailors and Marines seldom get to play a home game, since their missions take them all over the world.

In the words of the current Secretary of the Navy Carlos Del Toro, "LCS-23 honors the baseball greats, who in service of our nation, sacrificed their baseball careers for us. I have full confidence that the officers and crew of this great ship will continue to honor their legacy."

Capacity building refers to tasks and activities that create, expand or strengthen the systems and processes that help an organization carry out its anti-poverty work. These tasks and activities include the transfer of knowledge/skills, products, and relationships.

Who is eligible?


- Must be a U.S. Citizen, U.S. National, or Lawful Permanent Resident of the United States

NYC Civil Service Job Openings and Exams



Open Competitive Exams

Correction Officer - Correction Officers maintain security and are responsible for the care, custody, control, job training and work performance of sentenced and detained inmates within New York City correctional facilities. They supervise inmate meals, visits, recreational programs, and other congregate activities; inspect assigned areas for conditions which threaten safety and security; conduct searches in order to detect contraband; complete forms and reports; maintain appropriate log books; communicate with other area Correction Officers to exchange pertinent information; issue verbal orders, announcements and explanations to inmates; observe inmates and make recommendations concerning medical and/or psychiatric referrals; safeguard Department supplies and equipment; escort inmates within and outside of the facility including their transportation in Departmental vehicles; respond to unusual incidents and disturbances; enforce security procedures in accordance with Department guidelines; request medical assistance for inmates when necessary; count and verify the number of inmates present in assigned areas; verify identification of inmates; supervise inmates of either sex; operate a motor vehicle; and perform related work.

Procurement Analyst - Procurement Analysts assist procurement personnel in purchasing goods, services, construction and/or construction-related services, and/or in processing procurement documents and contracts; confer with, advise and assist operational, technical and professional staff in the procurement process and manage contracts for services as assigned.

Associate Project Manager - Associate Project Managers are responsible for project management work in planning, coordinating, and directing the implementation of the design and construction of capital projects of moderate size and complexity. They maintain a management information system to provide data for the planning and control for project development; establish project time and cost schedules; determine and coordinate the activities required between the persons, agencies and departments responsible for project completion; review all schedules, reports and orders prepared by consultants, contractors and agencies to assure conformance with project completion dates; check work performance and prepare management reports which stress significant problems; resolve problems that arise in meeting schedules and costs; meet with City agencies, contractors

and citizen groups; advise and make recommendations to client agencies in formulating project needs, options, and consequences, assuring that functional requirements are adequately articulated and that proposed projects fulfill these requirements; assist client agencies in developing scope of project, drawing upon own agency's technical resources to develop conceptual estimates and schedules; oversee the consultant selection and contracting process, and manage these contracts, or retain in-house design and construction management staff; with the client agency, conduct a post-occupancy evaluation of facilities; supervise subordinate employees; in the temporary absence of immediate supervisor, may assume the duties of that position; may incidentally perform duties of subordinates; and may drive a motor vehicle.
