The story of the 442nd Infantry Regiment serves as a powerful reminder of the sacrifices made by Asian Americans, Native Hawaiians, and Pacific Islanders in service to our country. It is a testament to the strength of our nation, to our ideals of democracy, our endeavor to form a more perfect union that despite being met by discrimination and adversity at every turn, members of these communities have

consistently answered the call to serve, protect, and defend the United States with unwavering pride and commitment.

As we celebrate Asian American, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander Heritage Month, we recognize the rich cultural heritage and profound contributions of these groups to our nation. We also reaffirm our commitment to creating a more inclusive and just society, one that fully recognizes the contributions of all Americans. 

Join NYC's Department of Veterans' Services at Fordham University for an exclusive screening of *Colonel Kalsi: Beyond The Call*. Created by a highly decorated and Emmy winning crew, *Colonel Kalsi: Beyond The Call* follows **Dr. Kamaljeet Kalsi's** story as an American Sikh Army officer struggling to serve his country with honor and dignity.

Dr. Kalsi was born a Sikh and grew up immersed in the traditions and tenets of his faith, wearing a turban and maintaining long hair and a beard as part of his strict religious uniform. When he entered training, the Army appeared to have no issue with Dr. Kalsi holding on to his religious identity or attire. But when the time came for him to deploy to Afghanistan, they reneged on their promise and demanded he

cut his hair and shave his beard, as it would interfere with the mission and "esprit de corps," a reason that was often given to keep marginalized groups out of the Armed Forces.

The evening will begin with light refreshments, followed by opening remarks and the screening at 5 PM with a 1-on-1 Q&A with Dr. Kalsi at the film's conclusion.

VISTA members serve at New York City government agencies (known as host sites) full-time from **July 31, 2023 to August 2, 2024** to address critical city issues related to poverty by engaging in capacity-building work. Capacity building refers to tasks and activities that create, expand or strengthen the systems and processes that help an organization carry out its anti-poverty work. These tasks and activities include the transfer of knowledge/skills, products, and relationships.

Critical Financial Assistance Programs



Goal: The Hope Fund for Critical Financial Assistance provides financial relief to all eras of military and Veteran caregivers through a grant that aims to put you and your family on the path to financial wellness. These grants aim to provide high-impact financial assistance to prevent or address a

significant crisis or to improve the quality of life of the caregiver family. These grants fill the gaps that other programs may not cover.

Who is eligible for the grant program?

- Adult caregiver, (18 years and older), for a military service member or veteran
- Demonstrates financial assistance need
- Vendor or name of Company is legally able to receive taxable income in the U.S., this includes they're being a citizen, green card holder, and/or permanent resident who can provide a W9 and SSN or (TIN)

Amount: Depending on need, grants will be made on a case-by-case review at the discretion of EDF staff. These are grants that aim to assist with larger needs to put you on a path of financial wellness.

How do you define "financial assistance needs"?

If you are experiencing an unforeseen emergency with life-changing consequences, we encourage you to apply.

Medical/Dental bills not covered by insurance
Home repairs/additions due to safety of Veteran
Car modifications needed for the Veteran
Certificate program to build job readiness skills for caregiver
Transportation

NYC Civil Service Job Openings and Exams



Open Competitive Exams

Assistant Mechanical Engineer - Assistant Mechanical Engineers, perform mechanical engineering work of moderate difficulty and responsibility and may supervise subordinate employees. They perform engineering calculations using college level math; perform design work on mechanical parts, basic plumbing, heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) systems and water distribution systems; prepare quantity estimates, cost estimates, memos, reports, letters and specifications; review manufacturers' catalogs and samples, drawings (shop, plan, construction, design), shop testing procedures for mechanical equipment to meet standards and outside consultants' designs; take photographs of project sites and details of existing buildings; take and verify measurements of buildings, bridges and mechanical parts; develop drawings of proposed and final designs, mechanical component sections and details; attend meetings with developers, contractors, architects and fabricators; participate in inspection operations by observing, checking and certifying the installation of materials and equipment; attest to equipment performance and test results of materials; research reference materials; may drive a motor vehicle or take public transportation to various work sites. All Assistant Mechanical Engineers perform related work.

Police Communications Technician - Police Communications

Technicians work in the Police Department Communications Section, serve as 911 call-takers; obtain necessary information from callers in order to initiate emergency assistance; serve as radio dispatchers of police resources; view pictures, videos and listen to audio attachments sent via "Text to 911"; and perform clerical, administrative and other duties related to the provision of emergency service.

Staff Analyst - Staff Analysts perform professional work of varying degrees of difficulty and responsibility in the preparation and administration of agency budgets and the conduct of economic research and studies; in the preparation and conduct of administrative, procedural and operational studies and analyses concerning the agency's organization and operations; and in personnel administration; may supervise and train less experienced staff. Staff Analysts utilize computers in the performance of these duties.
