## Second Round of Veterans Non-Profit Capital Program



The Veterans Nonprofit Capital Grant Program overseen by the New York State Department of Veterans' Services and administered by the Dormitory Authority of the State of New York, is a vital initiative dedicated to enhancing and enabling critical upgrades to the facilities of veterans organizations across the state. Following a successful first round with over \$2.5 million distributed, an additional \$2.4 million will be available through a second round of applications.

In this second round of funding, which will open for applications on **November 29**, **2023**, selected organizations will receive reimbursement for costs related to capital improvements, with awards ranging from \$25,000 to \$75,000. This invaluable support will enable these organizations to make critical upgrades, including new roofs, ADA-compliant enhancements, and renovations to common areas and kitchens.

A live presentation to provide interested organizations with information about how to prepare to apply for this funding opportunity was held on Friday, November 17 at 12:00 PM. A recording of the presentation has been made available on the DVS website.

#### History of Cypress Hills National Cemetery:

Cypress Hills National Cemetery, established in 1862, holds the distinction of being the first and largest national cemetery in New York City. Stretching 18 acres, it is the final resting place for some 27,000 individuals, spanning from the American Revolution to the Vietnam War. Among those interred are 24 Medal of Honor recipients, including three who received the honor twice. Last year's wreath-laying ceremony saw the placement of 6,048 wreaths, honoring the legacy and sacrifice of those interred there.

## VA pledges investigation into crisis line after whistleblower concerns

<u>Veterans Affairs officials</u> promised a full investigation into the operations of their suicide prevention hotline a day after whistleblowers told Congress that <u>some</u> <u>unstable callers may be getting ignored or lost in the system</u>.

In a letter to Senate Veterans' Affairs Committee ranking member Jerry Moran, R-Kansas, <u>VA Secretary Denis McDonough</u> said the goal of <u>the Veterans Crisis</u> <u>Line</u> must be to "make sure that veterans get the support they need, whenever and wherever they need it" and that he takes the recent whistleblower allegations "very seriously."

McDonough also committed to working with an upcoming <u>Government</u> <u>Accountability Office</u> investigation into the allegations.

On Wednesday, Moran voiced concerns about "gross mismanagement creating a danger to the health and safety of veterans nationwide" in the crisis line's operations and called for a full examination of the service.

The Veterans Crisis Line has seen a rapid expansion in recent years, growing from about 900 full-time employees in early 2021 to more than 1,800 today. It has also seen a dramatic rise in demand since last summer, when federal

officials launched a new three-digit dialing system — 988 — for individuals seeking emergency mental health care. [READ MORE...]
