NYC Boss Up Veterans Entrepreneurship Program



The **NYC Boss Up Veteran Entrepreneurship Program** focuses on veteran entrepreneurs living in New York City. SBS will provide the program's technical training components and all applicants will be provided with information about SBS's free business support services. SBS will provide the education, training, support, and mentorship necessary for professional growth and long-term success through its FastTrac® GrowthVenture[™] for Veterans. This course helps veterans apply skills they developed in the military to grow a successful and profitable business.

The **NYC Boss Up Veteran Entrepreneurship Program** will provide seven to 10 veteran entrepreneurs each with a grant of \$20,000 and enrollment in SBS's small business mentorship program to help build and grow their businesses. Applicants must apply to the program through the <u>online portal</u> by **11:00pm** on **October 6th**, **2023**. Applicants must be a military veteran and a current small business owner.

Eligible applicants will be reviewed in three rounds, culminating in a pitch and panel interview featuring SBS Commissioner Kim, DVS Commissioner Hendon, veterans, and stakeholders in the philanthropic and veteran communities. A virtual information session will be held on **Friday, September 22, 11 am – 12 pm**. Interested applicants can <u>register on Eventbrite</u>.

NYC Boss Up is a philanthropic program committed to encouraging excellence in entrepreneurship across New York City. The Ron and Kerry Moelis Family Foundation committed \$200,000 to support the veterans' cohort, which follows the successful NYC Boss Up Entrepreneurship Program partnership with the New York City Housing Authority (NYCHA) that provides \$1 million in grants over five years to budding entrepreneurs living in NYCHA residences.

The NYC Boss Up Veteran Entrepreneurship Program builds on the successful recovery of the New York City economy in the aftermath of the COVID-19 pandemic. By connecting military veteran entrepreneurs with grants and access to the world-class FastTrac® mentorship program, NYC Boss Up will prepare selected business owners to take their enterprises to the next level.

The Wall That Heals is a traveling replica of the **Vietnam Veterans Memorial** in Washington D.C. and mobile education center that will be coming to Flushing Meadows Corona Park in Queen this fall. The exhibit will be free and open to the public. The Wall That Heals honors the more than three million Americans who served in the U.S. Armed forces during the Vietnam War.

The exhibit is a 3/4 scale replica of the Vietnam Memorial in Washington, D.C., spanning 375 feet and measuring 7.5 feet at its apex. Over 58,000 names are inscribed on the wall with over 4,000 from New York State--including more than 1,700 hailing from New York City.



Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP): Back-to-School Edition



The Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) gives a discount on your household's monthly broadband internet service, if you are eligible. Participating broadband providers will apply this discount to your broadband plan.

If eligible, your household can receive:

- Up to a \$30/month discount on your internet service
- A one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, tablet, or desktop computer (you will need to pay a copay between \$10 and \$50)

Only one monthly service discount and one device discount is allowed per household

Your household may be eligible if someone in the household falls under just one of these criteria:

- If a household income is 200% or less than the federal poverty guideline (ex: at or less than \$35,775 for a household of 4)
- If you or your child or dependent participate in certain government assistance programs such as SNAP, Medicaid, WIC, or other programs
- If you or your child or dependent already receives a Lifeline benefit
- If a child in your household attends an NYC public school that participates in the free or reduced lunch program (all NYC public schools do!)
- Note: You do not need to be a U.S. citizen to be eligible. If you do not have a Social Security Number (SSN), you can provide other documents.
- Note: Additionally, customers are not required to submit to a credit check.

How to Apply

- 1. Go to GetInternet.Gov to submit an application or print out a mail-in application.
- 2. Contact your preferred participating provider to select an eligible plan and have the discount applied to your bill.
 - a. Note: Enrollment is not complete until the provider confirms your plan.

Some providers may have an alternative application they will ask you to complete. Eligible households must both apply for the program and contact a participating provider to select a service plan.

Bradsher becomes first woman confirmed to VA's second-highest post



By Leo Shane III Published: September 12, 2023 | 12:29 PM Army veteran Tanya Bradsher will serve as the Department of Veterans Affairs <u>first confirmed female deputy secretary</u> after a 50-46 Senate vote on Tuesday finalized her nomination.

Bradsher, 53, has served as chief of staff to <u>VA Secretary Denis</u> <u>McDonough</u> since March 2021. The Iraq war veteran, who is Black, is also the first woman of color to ever hold the VA leadership post.

Tuesday's vote came almost two months after <u>Sen. Chuck Grassley, R-Iowa,</u> <u>objected to her nomination</u> over concerns that she failed to protect personal information of VA whistleblowers during her duties as department chief of staff. The move was another in a long series of confirmation blockades by Republican lawmakers for defense and veterans posts this year.

But Senate Democratic leaders worked around Grassley's opposition to advance Bradsher's nomination. She is expected to be sworn into the post in the next few days.

"It is clear that she is qualified for the job and ready to hit the ground running to serve our nation's veterans," <u>Senate Veterans Affairs Committee Chairman Jon</u> <u>Tester</u>, D-Mont., said in a floor speech Monday night. [READ MORE...]
