Earlier this year, March 29, 2023, marked the 50th anniversary of the end of U.S. combat operations in Vietnam. A commemorative act that provided all Americans with an opportunity to reflect on the lasting impact of this pivotal moment in history.

For many Vietnam veterans, the scars and memories of that time remain everpresent. However, littered amidst these memories, another opportunity presents itself as a beacon of healing and remembrance in the form of "<u>The Wall That</u> <u>Heals</u>." The Wall That Heals will be in <u>Flushing Meadows Corona Park</u> from Sept. 28 to Oct. 1.This traveling replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial serves as a powerful symbol of tribute and reconciliation for those who answered the call, choosing to don the uniform in a time of war and defend this nation. For those Veterans who may not have had the opportunity to visit the original memorial in Washington, D.C., having The Wall That Heals in their own city provides an invaluable chance to heal and find solace. It offers a sacred space where they can honor their fallen comrades, reconnect with their own experiences and share their stories with others who can truly understand.

However, the impact of The Wall That Heals extends far beyond the Veteran community. This exhibit holds immense importance to all members of the body

public, as it provides a glimpse into one of the more challenging conflicts in our nation's history—from the Sailor, Soldier, Marine and Airman to the supporter to the anti-war activist—the impact of the Vietnam War remains key to unraveling the complex relationships between the military and the community at-large. NYC Boss Up Veterans Entrepreneurship Program



The **NYC Boss Up Veteran Entrepreneurship Program** focuses on veteran entrepreneurs living in New York City. SBS will provide the program's technical training components and all applicants will be provided with information about SBS's free business support services. SBS will provide the education, training, support, and mentorship necessary for professional growth and long-term success through its FastTrac® GrowthVenture[™] for Veterans. This course helps veterans apply skills they developed in the military to grow a successful and profitable business.

The **NYC Boss Up Veteran Entrepreneurship Program** will provide seven to 10 veteran entrepreneurs each with a grant of \$20,000 and enrollment in SBS's small business mentorship program to help build and grow their businesses. Applicants must apply to the program through the <u>online portal</u> by **11:00pm** on **October 6th**, **2023**. Applicants must be a military veteran and a current small business owner.

Eligible applicants will be reviewed in three rounds, culminating in a pitch and panel interview featuring SBS Commissioner Kim, DVS Commissioner Hendon, veterans, and stakeholders in the philanthropic and veteran communities. A virtual information session will be held on **Friday, September 22, 11 am – 12 pm**. Interested applicants can <u>register on Eventbrite</u>.

NYC Boss Up is a philanthropic program committed to encouraging excellence in entrepreneurship across New York City. The Ron and Kerry Moelis Family Foundation committed \$200,000 to support the veterans' cohort, which follows the successful NYC Boss Up Entrepreneurship Program partnership with the New York City Housing Authority (NYCHA) that provides \$1 million in grants over five years to budding entrepreneurs living in NYCHA residences.

The NYC Boss Up Veteran Entrepreneurship Program builds on the successful recovery of the New York City economy in the aftermath of the COVID-19 pandemic. By connecting military veteran entrepreneurs with grants and access to the world-class FastTrac® mentorship program, NYC Boss Up will prepare selected business owners to take their enterprises to the next level.

Missing F-35 stealth jet presumed to have crashed was seen 'almost going inverted' before disaster: witness



By <u>Isabel Keane</u>, New York Post Published Sep. 21, 2023, 9:16 a.m. ET The <u>missing F-35 stealth jet</u> presumed to have crashed in South Carolina over the weekend was spotted "almost going inverted" as it flew about 100 feet above the treetops just before the disaster, according to a witness.

Adrian and Stephen Truluck were celebrating their son's 7th birthday at their Williamsburg County, South Carolina, home on Sunday when they spotted a low-flying aircraft — before hearing a "boom" sound.

"Our kids always give a little salute, so we said, 'Look at the plane. Oh my gosh, it's so low,'" <u>Adrian told NBC News</u>. "And it was kind of probably 100 feet above the treetops, and almost going inverted."

"It was probably three-quarters of the way," her husband Stephen added, noting that they could "see the canopy" of the jet.

Soon after witnessing the jet, they recalled hearing a "boom sound," which they said at the time they chalked up to stormy weather.

The couple said they didn't think much of the low-flying plane, as Shaw Air Force Base is about 60 miles from their home.

Only the next day when they learned that a debris field was discovered mere miles from their home did they realize they had seen the missing jet, likely moments before it crashed.

"We were thinking it was rolling thunder in the distance and didn't give it another thought until we saw the plane was missing," Adrian said, "and we were like, 'That had to be the plane." [READ MORE...]


