

Suicide Awareness and Mental Health Symposium - Brooklyn Public Library



September is Suicide Awareness Month.

Suicide among servicemembers, Veterans, and their families is a public health crisis. Veteran suicide takes a toll on the Veteran and the entire family. Raising awareness about Veteran suicide is a vital aspect of prevention.

In partnership with the <u>U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs</u>, <u>Live Whole Health</u>, the <u>National Alliance on Mental Illness</u>, and <u>Ohel Children's Home and Family Services</u>, the <u>NYC Department of Veterans' Services (DVS)</u> will host a day of resource presentations for Veterans, military families, and anyone who has experienced loss due to suicide.

The Suicide and Mental Health Symposium will be held on September 16 from 10 am-3 pm at the <u>Brooklyn Public Library (Central Library)</u> located at 10 Grand Army Plaza.
