Expectations with Large Scale Events

- Large crowds, long wait times, and extreme heat
- Increased risk of exploitation, scams, and trafficking
- All tickets should be from official FIFA online sources; be very weary of resales

Protect Yourself & Others

- Stay hydrated, wear sunscreen/hat
- Keep your phone charged & share your location with a trusted contact

Know Your Rights (NYC)

- You have the right to speak for yourself and keep your documents
- You have the right to fair pay, safe work, and medical care
- You can seek help regardless of immigration status

Support Needed?

- Immediate danger such as lost minor
 - Call 911 for NYPD support
- Medical
 - Seek medical tent at events or call 911 or 988 (mental health)
- Runaway and Homeless Youth (RHY)
 - See Palm Card and connect with Drop-In Center for support
- Mental Health Crisis
 - Call 988 for support or to request a mobile crisis team
- Confidential Support for Domestic and Gender-Based Violence
 - Visit NYC HOPE Resource Directory or NYC Family Justice Centers
 - Call NYC's 24-Hour Hope Hotline: 1-800-621-HOPE (4673)
- Schools
 - School Counselors and Social Workers are available on school days to support students and families. Parent Coordinators are available to support parents and guardians with any needs or referrals
