Participants will have the opportunity to explore career interests and express themselves creatively through learning experiences designed to strengthen social, civic, and leadership abilities.

Program: Knockout COVID: Youth Campaign

Partner Org: Neighborhood Opportunity Network (DOP)

Under the guidance of mentors and media experts, youth developed media campaigns on the importance of social distancing while receiving stipends for their efforts. The youth campaigns are currently being finalized, and will be promoted via social media and other platforms to young people citywide.

Program: Anti-Gun Violence Employment Program (AGVEP)

Partner Org: Mayor's Office of Criminal Justice

Starting on July 13th, AGVEP began employing ~700 New Yorkers between the ages 14 and 24 living in neighborhoods and NYCHA housing developments most significantly impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Participants are engaging in 10 to 15 hours of activities for a 6-week period, with the potential to earn a stipend of \$850 to \$1,200.

YMI Addresses the Digital Divide

The impact of COVID-19 coupled with social distancing has had a profound impact on all of the YMI funded programs. In order to ensure our partners could continue their important programming, YMI procured laptops and other technology for a host of programs.

In partnership with The Human Resources Administration, YMI was able to provide 305 laptops to the nine (9) YMI-funded <u>Jobs-Plus</u> providers to be distributed to those in need. The laptops allow participants to search for work, attend trainings and receive city services remotely.

The Department of Youth and Community Development and the Center for Youth Employment recently launched SYEP

Summer Bridge, an alternative SYEP program that will serve over 35,000 low-income and vulnerable young New Yorkers for five-weeks starting on July 27, 2020. Participants will explore various career opportunities, learn workplace competency skills and engage in critical thinking exercises. Additionally, participants will have the opportunity to network with professionals, participate in workplace challenges, engage in social-emotional learning programming and receive information on available social service supports. YMI has supported this initiative through procuring 800+ iPads with internet connectivity for participants who do not have laptops or internet access. Lastly, YMI invested in CareerClue which will provide STEAM education enhancements for ~1000+ students participating in SYEP. The program will provide much needed academic curriculum to address learning loss due to COVID-19 as well as teach participants about careers in the STEAM sector.
