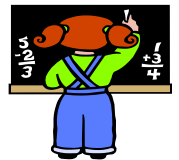

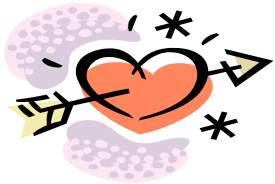

An **OUTBREAK** of **MENINGITIS** has recently been identified among gay & bisexual men.

WHO IS AT RISK?

Men who are HIV-infected and have had intimate contact with another man met either through an online website, digital application ("app"), or at a bar or party since September 1, 2012.

Men who are HIV-negative who have had intimate contact with another man met either through an online website, digital application ("app"), or at a bar or party since September 1, 2012 and live in Bedford Stuyvesant, Brownsville, Bushwick, Clinton Hill, Crown Heights, Downtown, Dumbo, East New York, Prospect Heights or Williamsburg.

HOW DOES IT SPREAD?

It can spread through kissing and having sex or by sharing utensils, a drinking glass, or a cigarette with an infected person. It is **NOT** spread by breathing the air around an infected person.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS?

Symptoms include:

Approximately 20% of people who develop the disease die of it.

IF YOU DEVELOP ANY OF THESE SYMPTOMS, YOU SHOULD SEEK MEDICAL CARE IMMEDIATELY.

HOW CAN I PROTECT MYSELF?

- A vaccine ("meningococcal vaccine") may provide protection within 7 to 10 days, but it does not always work in all persons who are vaccinated.
- If you are HIV-infected, you should return to your health care provider eight weeks later for a second dose of the vaccine.

Auto Theft Prevention Tips

In the United States, a vehicle is stolen every 21 minutes. Follow these tips to minimize your chances of becoming the victim of auto theft.

- Never leave your car running unattended
- Never leave any keys in the car, the ignition, or in hide-a-key boxes
- Always roll up your windows and lock the car
- Never leave valuables in plain view, even if your car is locked.
- Remove GPS mounts, and the tell-tale ring that is left by suction cups on the dashboard
- Always park in high-traffic, well-lighted areas
- Investigate the purchase of a vehicle theft tracking/security system, especially if you own one of the frequently stolen model vehicles such as a Honda Civic
- Never leave personal identification documents, such as the vehicle ownership title, or credit cards in your vehicle
- Do not store your home address in your GPS system, but rather use a nearby intersection of business address.
- If you must leave your key with a valet, attendant, or mechanic leave only the ignition key and not any house keys. Make sure you are dealing with a reputable firm, you can check with the Department of Consumer Affairs for more information
- In high theft areas the Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) should be etched on windows, doors, fenders and trunk lid. This makes it difficult for a thief to market your stolen car parts.
- Copy your license plate and vehicle information (VIN) numbers on a card
- If your vehicle is stolen, report it to the police immediately.

Free NYPD Auto Theft Reduction Programs

As part of their ongoing effort to reduce auto theft, the NYPD offers the following Auto Theft Reduction Programs:

V.I.N. Etching Program: The vehicle's Vehicle Identification Number is etched onto all of the vehicles windows. The program serves to deter theft and trace the stolen parts.

Combat Auto Theft: Registering your automobile into the C.A.T. Program authorizes the Police to stop your vehicle between the hours of 1 A.M. and 5 A.M. (when many vehicles are stolen) for the purpose of determining if the vehicle is stolen.

Commuter C.A.T. Program: Similar to C.A.T. program, this program was designed for commuters who park there car during daytime hours (10 A.M. Through 4 P.M.)

H.E.A.T. (Help End Auto Theft): Persons under the age of 25 can not drive the vehicle and you must be over 40 years of age to register your vehicle in this program. Note: You may be eligible to obtain a discount on your car insurance by utilizing these various programs. For further information, contact your insurance representative.
