#### **JOB DESCRIPTION:**

Under minimum direction, with a broad scope for the exercise of independent initiative and judgment within various areas of MIS, the Lead Applications Developer will perform managerial oversight and provide comprehensive technical expertise in a variety of MIS endeavors. Specific duties will include:

- Manage, design, develop, and support all phases of the full project life cycle for existing or new project initiatives.
- Manage and provide guidance to technical staff.
- Lead the development team to complete deliverables according to project plan milestones.
- Define project scope and oversee the technical architecture requirements.
- Develop efficient and usable JAVA programming for web based applications.
- Build database query using PL/SQL.
- Manage version control of application code by using PVCS version manager software.
- Migrate applications from non-standard technologies to agency standard core technologies (i.e. Oracle Application Server environment).

## PREFERRED SKILLS:

The preferred candidate should posses strong hands on programming skills in Java, Servlet, JSP, JSTL, Tag libraries, LDAP, HTML, Javascript, Spring, Hibernate, Oracle PL/SQL, Oracle 9iAS/10g Application Server Architecture, JDeveloper, and PVCS. Prior exposure to Cold Fusion, Curam, UNIX, and Oracle Report integration is desirable. Knowledge of CONNECTIONS, Welfare Management System (WMS), Child Care Review Service (CCRS), and Comprehensive Justice Information System (CJIS) is a plus.

# **QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:**

A master's degree in computer science from an accredited college and three years of progressively more responsible, full-time, satisfactory experience using information technology in computer applications programming, systems programming, computer systems development, data telecommunications, database administration, planning of data/information processing, user services, or area networks at least 18 months of this experience must have been in an administrative, managerial or executive capacity in the areas of computer applications programming, systems programming, computer systems development, data telecommunications, data base administration, or planning of data processing or in the supervision of staff performing these duties; or
- 2. A baccalaureate degree from an accredited college and four years of experience as described in "1" above; or
- 3. A four-year high school diploma or its educational equivalent approved by a State's department of education or recognized accrediting organization and six years of experience as described in "1" above; or
- 4. A satisfactory combination of education and experience equivalent to "1", "2" or "3" above. However, all candidates must have at least a four-year high school diploma or its educational equivalent approved by a State's department of education or recognized accrediting organization and must possess at least three years of experience as described in "1" above, including the 18 months of administrative, managerial, executive or supervisory experience as described in "1" above.
