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Past Improvements

Public Realm and Bike Network Improvements: Painted Bike Corral:

 In coordination with the DOT Art Program, DOT installed a curb extension on 31st Ave and 34th St. featuring a new public art installation, and bike parking

Open Streets

 2020: OS in partnership with 31st Ave Coalition; maintenance and operational support by DOT and the Horticultural Society of New York

Bike Lane Projects:

- 2021: Astoria Bike Network, Northern Blvd
- 2020: Crescent St
- 2017: Hoyt Ave N
- 2016: Shore Blvd, 20th Ave Upgrade, 31st Ave
- 2015: Vernon Blvd.

Since 2015, DOT has installed over 16.5 lane miles of protected bike lanes, and 21 lane miles of standard bike lanes and shared lanes in the area.












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Background

Open Street Protected Bike Lane Conventional Bike Lane Shared Lane

- Vernon Blvd 30th St
- Mostly residential area
- Access to waterfront
- - 30th St Steinway St
 - Commercial land uses
 - Open Street (Sat., Sun. 12-8 PM)
- Steinway St 51st St
 - Residential; auto-oriented businesses; schools

Summary of Outreach

Online Survey

(April - June 2023)



2,200+ responses; 92% of respondents lived in the area. Questions on people's ideas for improvements

Five Pop-Up Workshops

(Summer, 2023)



Five pop-ups to gather additional feedback on safety and overall street improvements people would like to see realized

Merchant Survey

(July 2023)



99 businesses surveyed along 31st Ave on questions related to loading, deliveries, and other business-related issues

In-Person Workshop

(Sept. 2023)



More than 150 people attended the in-person workshop where DOT requested feedback on conceptual designs

What We've Heard



Survey: Most Frequently Mentioned Safety Concerns

- Vehicles disregard traffic signals (400+ responses)
- Lack of protected bike lanes (300+)
- Double parking for extended periods of time 250)
- Excessive vehicular speeding (180)
- Unsafe intersection crossings 150)

Intersections with most comments:

- 1. Newtown Rd, 31 Ave and 43 St
- 2. Vernon Blvd and 31 Ave
- 3. 31 St and 31 Ave
- 4. Crescent St and 31 Ave
- 5. 33 St and 31 Ave



Merchant Survey: Most Frequently Mentioned

- Lack of curb access for deliveries
- Delivery trucks double park on 31st Ave
- Merchants have no control of delivery times
- Many businesses have cyclists deliver their goods
- Roadway is too narrow

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
Project Background

Current Conditions on 31st Avenue, Vernon Boulevard to 51st Street














Since 2015, DOT has installed over 16.5 lane miles of protected bike lanes, and 21 lane miles of standard bike lanes and shared lanes in the area:

- 2021: Astoria Bike Network, Northern Boulevard
- 2020: Crescent Street
- 2016: Hoyt Avenue North
- 2016: Shore Boulevard, 20th Avenue Upgrade, 31st Avenue
- 2015: Vernon Boulevard

Previous Outreach & Workshops:

Astoria Bike Network & Public Realm Community Survey (April-June 2023)

 Over 2,200 responses; 92% of respondents live in the area

Pop-Up Workshops (Summer 2023)

Visioning workshops across 5 locations

31st Ave. Merchant Survey (July 2023)

99 businesses on 31st Ave. surveyed

Community Planning Workshop (September 2023)

150 people provided feedback on conceptual designs

What We've Heard:

Bike Infrastructure

- Lack of protected bike lanes in the area
- Desire to upgrade existing and create new bike lanes:
 - New: 31st, 33rd, 21st, Steinway, 29th
 - Upgrade: 35th, 36th

Corridor Operations & Curb Management

- Need to maintain access to the curb
- Frequent double parking

Pedestrian & Public Realm Infrastructure

- Safer crossings requested at 31st Ave. and:
 - Newtown Road Vernon Boulevard

 - 31st Street
 - Crescent Street
 - 33rd Street
- Desire for expanded public space and programming
- Requests for daylighting at intersections
- Need for traffic calming on the corridor

31st Ave. in Astoria is within a Vision Zero Priority Area.

Priority Corridors:


- 21st, 31st, 33rd, 38th, & Steinway St.









31st Avenue Corridor Concept and Project Phasing




Conceptual 31st Avenue Corridor Sections

- Improve and strengthen bicycle connections through protected bike lanes on 31st Avenue
- Expand pedestrian space in the heart of 31st Avenue's commercial area
