

Project and Program Overview




### **Pre Open Street History**


- DOT implemented a street improvement project at St. Nicholas, Audubon, and W 165 St in Summer 2020
- The project simplified a very complex intersection making it safer for pedestrians and easier crossings




### **Open Street Overview**

- Piloted Open Street: Full Closure since summer 2024 – 24/7 schedule
- Daily maintenance and operations services by the Hort (DOT contractor)
  - Setting up/breaking down tables, chairs, and umbrellas daily
  - 2x daily sweeping + cleaning, and pressure washing monthly
  - Horticulture care seasonally
  - Ongoing programming
- Per program legislation, successful Open Streets are considered for permanent streetscape and traffic calming elements




























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# Community Outreach and Plaza Proposal Overview




### **Community Feedback Survey**

- Throughout the summer and fall 2024, NYC DOT facilitated a feedback survey for the community to share comments and ideas for the Audubon Open Street
- The survey was promoted via signage, email outreach, newsletters, and so on.
- The survey was available in both English and Spanish
- 259 individuals responded to the survey between June 2024 and January 2025





# Do you want to see the proposed Open Street on Audubon Avenue?



#### Positive Feedback:

- Community Space: Many respondents appreciate the idea of creating an open space for community use
- **Pedestrian Safety:** Some feedback highlighted the improvement in pedestrian safety, particularly for children, elderly, and residents who walk in the area.
- **Support for Local Businesses**: A few responses suggested that creating pedestrian spaces boosts business activity nearby

#### Concerns and Other Feedback:


- Parking Issues: Some responses focused on the loss of parking spaces because of the Open Street
- Disruption to Local Traffic: A few responses mentioned the disruption caused by diverting traffic and how it affects those who rely on vehicles to navigate the area
- Quality of Life Issues: Some respondents noted certain quality of life impacts as a result of the Open Street

### Plaza Proposal



### Plaza Design


- Formally redesign Audubon Ave between W 165 and W 166 Sts as a pedestrian plaza
- Using in-house materials like pavement markings, planters, granite blocks, flexible delineators, and movable furniture to element
- Working with an artist to do public art mural as ground treatment





### W 167-W 168 Design

- Add curb extensions at W 167 St and Audubon Ave and W 168 St and Audubon Ave
- Shortens crossing distances, increases visibility between pedestrians, cyclists, and drivers, and adds space for amenities (planters, bike corrals, etc.)
- Implemented using standard DOT materials, using epoxy gravel as a ground treatment





### Plaza Proposal Outreach

- NYC DOT partnered with Street Lab to collect community feedback and ideas for the plaza proposal on Audubon Avenue
- Using its IMAGINE pop up, Street Lab hosted 6 community workshops on Audubon in June and September 2025
- IMAGINE is Street Lab's pop-up community engagement program complete with different hands-on activities and display panels that help facilitate engagement




### Plaza Proposal Outreach

- Feedback was overall positive, as participants both young and old shared their pleasure and excitement about the new plaza.
- When asked how the new community space made participants feel, they shared "happy/feliz," "fortunate," "grateful," and "connected to community," among others.
- Participants shared memories of summer growing up in the neighborhood playing games in the street like stickball and baseball, riding bikes, going on walks with friends, and connected these activities to things that could be done in the new plaza.





#### **Plaza Rules**

- When using pedestrian plazas, everyone must comply with all plaza rules posted in Chapter 4 of Title 34 of the Rules of the City of New York
- Street Activity Permit Office (SAPO) permits are required for all events and programming in the plaza. Apply at <a href="https://nyc.gov/SAPO">nyc.gov/SAPO</a>
- Anyone can apply to host an event or programming in the plaza as long as they get a SAPO permit
- SAPO permits are reviewed by the Community Board and NYPD and they may recommend approval or denial
- Other permits may be required for events (e.g. amplified sound permits, etc.)

#### **Pedestrian Plaza Rules Prohibit:**

- Obstruction of pedestrian traffic
- Destruction, removal or tampering of any property or equipment
- Camping
- Unattended property
- A person or their belongings taking up more than one seat
- Consumption of alcoholic beverages, except as otherwise permitted
- Skateboarding
- Feeding of undomesticated animals
- Spitting, urination, defecation
- Unreasonable noise
- Dogs off-leash

Bicycle riding is only permitted on designated routes or where indicated by signage or markings

## **DOT Art Program Overview**

NYC DOT Art commissions artists to design and paint temporary murals onto fully pedestrianized asphalt spaces, concrete jersey barriers, and other eligible NYC DOT infrastructure. Professional artists may apply to NYC DOT Art's biennial open call soliciting qualifications to be selected for inclusion in an artist registry, and the opportunity to be short-listed to create a proposal for specific mural opportunities.





**Mural Experience:** I've been painting murals since 2022 where I started with a local shop in Astoria. I since then have painted 2 asphalt murals with NYC DOT and have painted large walls for small businesses, a wooden panel for Ottomanelli's restaurant, and have painted objects like a 96 gallon trash can for Coachella Music Festival and a wooden playhouse for the Brooklyn Children's Museum.


Talisa is a Dominican artist and feels a great sense of connection to the community of Washington Heights. She is already known by the community who has tapped her to paint a small shed in the area.
