






Background

Bruckner Blvd School Safety Improvements



Why are we here?

- DREAM Charter School concerns about student safety on high-traffic truck route
- Longstanding complaints about pedestrian safety and access at South Bronx Charter School for International Culture and the Arts (SBCSICA)
- DOT effort to build a Harlem River Greenway in the Bronx includes recent community workshops



School Outreach

Aug 2023 Walkthrough with Deputy Council Speaker Ayala, DOT Commissioner Rodríguez, and DREAM Charter School to discuss traffic safety

Sep 2023 DOT met with DREAM Charter School

Jan 2024 DOT & DREAM Charter School walkthrough

Feb 2024 Stakeholder meeting at DREAM Charter School

May 2024 Meetings with South Bronx Charter for International Cultures and the Arts and DREAM Charter

Recent work:

- DOT installed quick curb along the double-yellow centerline between Lincoln Ave and Alexander Ave to reduce U-turns.
- Expanded the school loading zone at DRFAM Charter School.
- Upgraded pedestrian ramps at South Bronx Charter for International Cultures and the Arts



Harlem River Greenway

- Create a continuous and connected path for cyclists, pedestrians, runners, and others
- New transportation option both for recreation and commuting
- Connect people to the waterfront and parks
- Provide convenient and safe connections to greenway paths from the local street network.



Harlem River Greenway: South Bronx Outreach

Building on previous work and working closely with local partners/advocates, DOT has been conducting outreach since Spring 2023 to collect feedback from community members.

Bruckner Blvd is the way to go. It's the **most direct**.


Take **schools** into account!

Make the connection to Randall's Island.


Greenway should connect to Willis Ave bridge We need traffic safety for schools


Harlem River Greenway: What We Heard About Bruckner Blvd

- DOT talked to community members about greenway routing alternatives in the area between Lincoln Ave and the Randall's Island Connector
- Bruckner Blvd is the preferred nearterm route for the Harlem River Greenway
- Workshop participants liked the directness of the route, access to the Willis Ave bridge, and connections to waterfront spaces and Randall's Island Park



Harlem River Greenway: What We Heard About Bruckner Blvd

- Community members have long voiced a desire for a continuous greenway along the Harlem River for cyclists and pedestrians
- Simultaneously, DOT received multiple requests to improve safety around schools on Bruckner Blvd
- We have an opportunity to implement a school-focused project that will also form a piece of the Harlem River Greenway




Harlem River Greenway: Project Phasing

2024 project will focus on immediate school safety concerns:

- Bruckner Blvd between Lincoln Ave and Willis Ave, including DREAM Charter School
- E 133 St at Cypress Pl, including SBCSICA

2025+ project will close the greenway gap between Willis Ave and St. Ann's




Bruckner Blvd School Safety Improvements

Safety Data 2019-2023

- 273 total injuries
- 20 severe injuries
- 1 cyclist fatality at Brown PI
- Pedestrians and cyclists make up 29% of severe injuries and fatalities






Existing Conditions: Lincoln Ave to Willis Ave

- Local truck route
- Varying roadway widths
- Higher traffic volume westbound to 3 Ave Bridge
- Light eastbound traffic










Existing Conditions: Lincoln Ave to Alexander Ave

- Long pedestrian crossing distances
- Excess width leads to speeding near school
- Long distances between pedestrian crossings
- High volume of students crossing mid-block
- Student loading challenges
- Illegal mid-block U-turns
- High loading demand for businesses






Existing Conditions: Lincoln Ave to Alexander Ave



Existing Conditions: Alexander Ave to Willis Ave


- Long pedestrian crossing distances
- Active retail, high-density housing
- Metered parking on north curb to accommodate high parking/loading demand
- New residential building under construction








 High-volume double-right turn from Major Deegan Expy off-ramp onto westbound Bruckner Blvd across an active crosswalk





Safety Benefits of Bike Lanes


Street designs that include protected bike lanes increase safety for all users

- -15% drop in all crashes with injuries
- -21% drop in pedestrian injuries

on streets where protected bike lanes were installed 2007-2017

Before and After Crash Data, 2007 - 2017








Data from 25 separate protected bicycle lane projects installed from 2007-2014 with 3 years of after data. Includes portions of 1 Ave, 2 Ave, 8 Ave, 9 Ave, Broadway, Columbus Ave, Hudson St, Lafayette St / 4 Ave, Sands St, Allen/Pike St, Kent Ave, Prospect Park West, Flushing Ave, Bruckner Blvd & Longfellow Ave, Imlay St / Conover St, Paerdegat Ave. Only sections of projects that included protected bike lanes were analyzed.


Proposal Overview: Lincoln Ave to Willis Ave


- One eastbound and two westbound travel lanes
- 2-way protected bike lane along south curb
- Painted shared pedestrian space in front of DREAM Charter School
- Signalized pedestrian crossing mid-block between Lincoln Ave and Alexander Ave
- Add exclusive pedestrian crossing times at Lincoln Ave, Alexander Ave, and Willis Ave
- Willis Ave (Bruckner Blvd to E 132 St)
 - Convert to one-way southbound
 - Add angled parking





Proposal: Lincoln Ave to Alexander Ave

- New mid-block signalized pedestrian crossing
- Painted shared space in front of DREAM Charter School
 - Markings and signage establish pedestrian priority when bike lanes end
 - Operational flexibility for school
- Leading pedestrian internal signal phases for all crosswalks at Lincoln Ave and at Alexander Ave
- Remove 10 parking spaces to make room for the mid-block signal and improve visibility at Alexander Ave













Proposal: Alexander Ave to Willis Ave


- Protected turn signal phase and turn bay for westbound left turn from Bruckner Blvd to Alexander Ave
- Remove 7 parking spaces to make room for new turn lane













Proposal: Willis Ave Intersection

- Convert Willis Ave to one-way southbound (Bruckner Blvd to E 132 St)
- Add perpendicular crosswalks across
 Bruckner Blvd to shorten crossings and improve connection to Willis Ave Br shared path
- Add "Barnes Dance" pedestrian-only signal phase, mitigating all vehicular turning conflicts with pedestrians
- Install 2 pedestrian islands
- Add 6 parking spaces on Willis Ave






Proposal: E 133 St at Cypress Pl

- New stop signs and crosswalks across E 133 St to school
- Added pedestrian space in front of the school
- Remove 6 parking spaces to make room for added pedestrian space and new crosswalks


Summary

- Install 2-way protected bike lanes on the south curb of Bruckner Blvd (Lincoln Ave to Willis Ave) and shared pedestrian space in front of DREAM Charter School
- New mid-block signalized pedestrian crossing across Bruckner Blvd between Lincoln Ave and Alexander Ave
- New crosswalks across Bruckner Blvd at Willis Ave
- Convert Willis Ave to one-way southbound (Bruckner Blvd to E 132 St) and add angled parking
- Add exclusive pedestrian crossing times to crosswalks at Lincoln Ave and at Alexander Ave, and an all-pedestrian "Barnes Dance" signal phase at Willis Ave
- New stop-controlled crosswalks across E 133 St to the South Bronx Charter School at Cypress Pl

Benefits

- Improved pedestrian access with 6 new crosswalks
- Shorter pedestrian crossings
- Signal timing enhancements give pedestrians a head start, and completely mitigate the heavy turn conflicts at the Major Deegan Expy off-ramp
- Slower vehicular turns, reduced speeding
- Shared space in front of DREAM Charter provides operational flexibility
- New segment of the Harlem River Greenway with critical connection to Willis Ave Br
