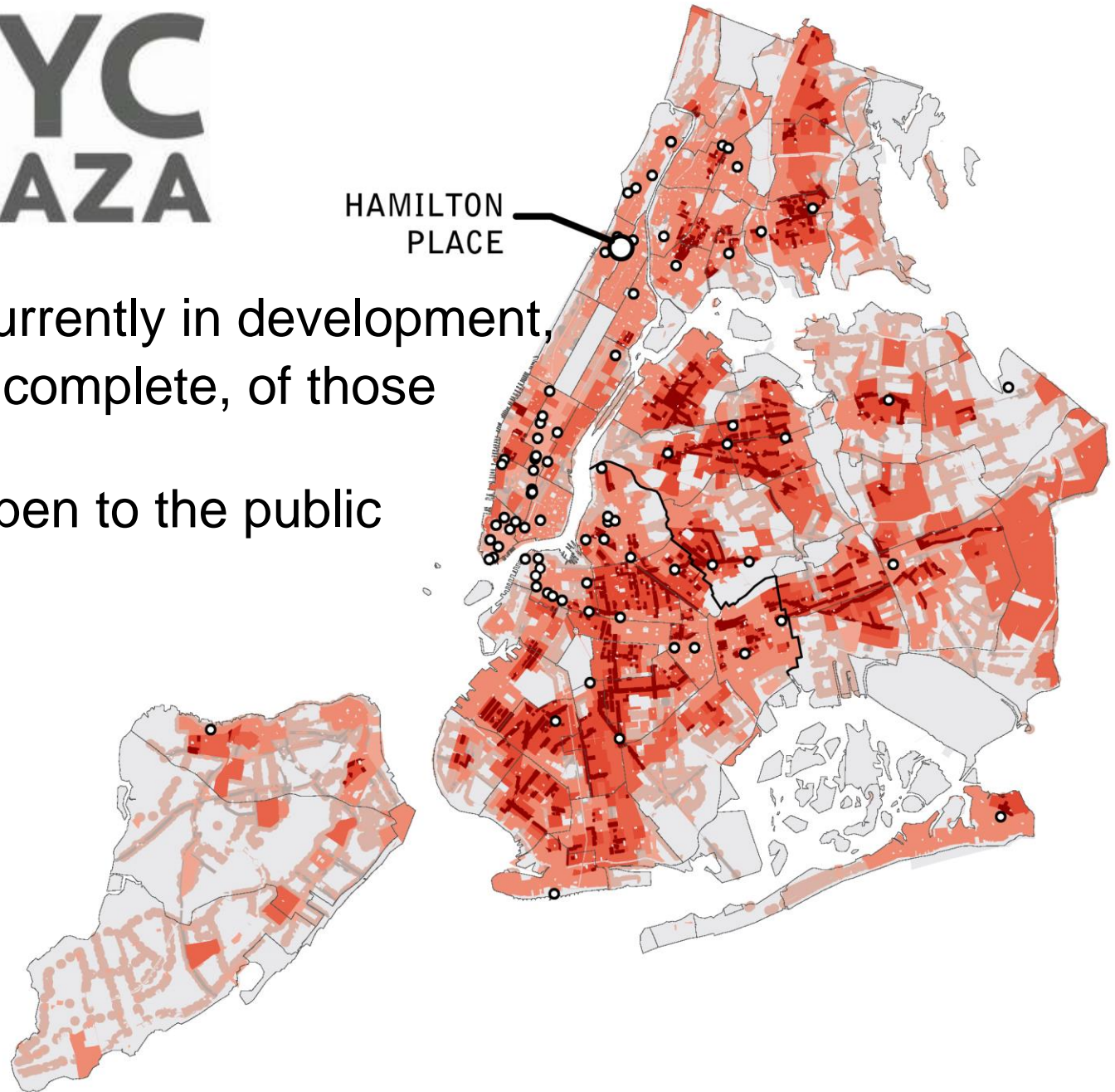

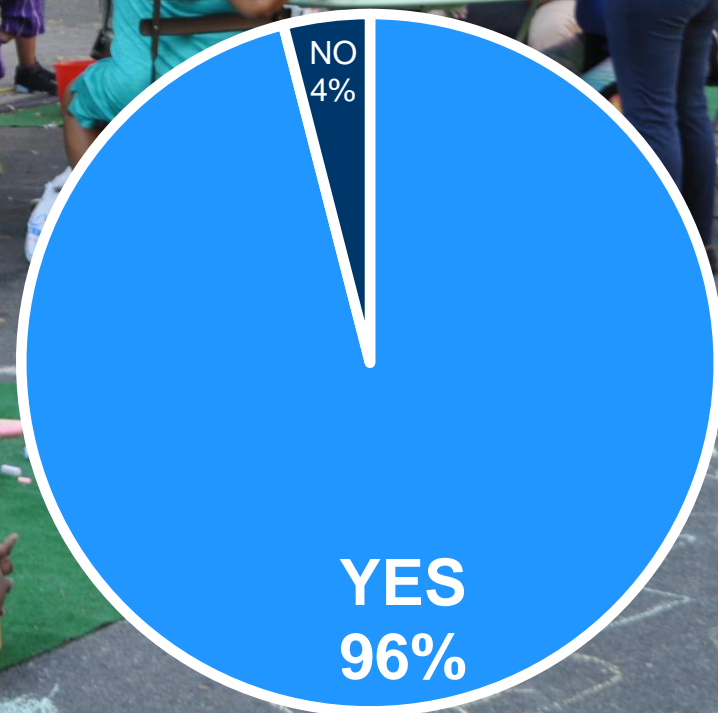

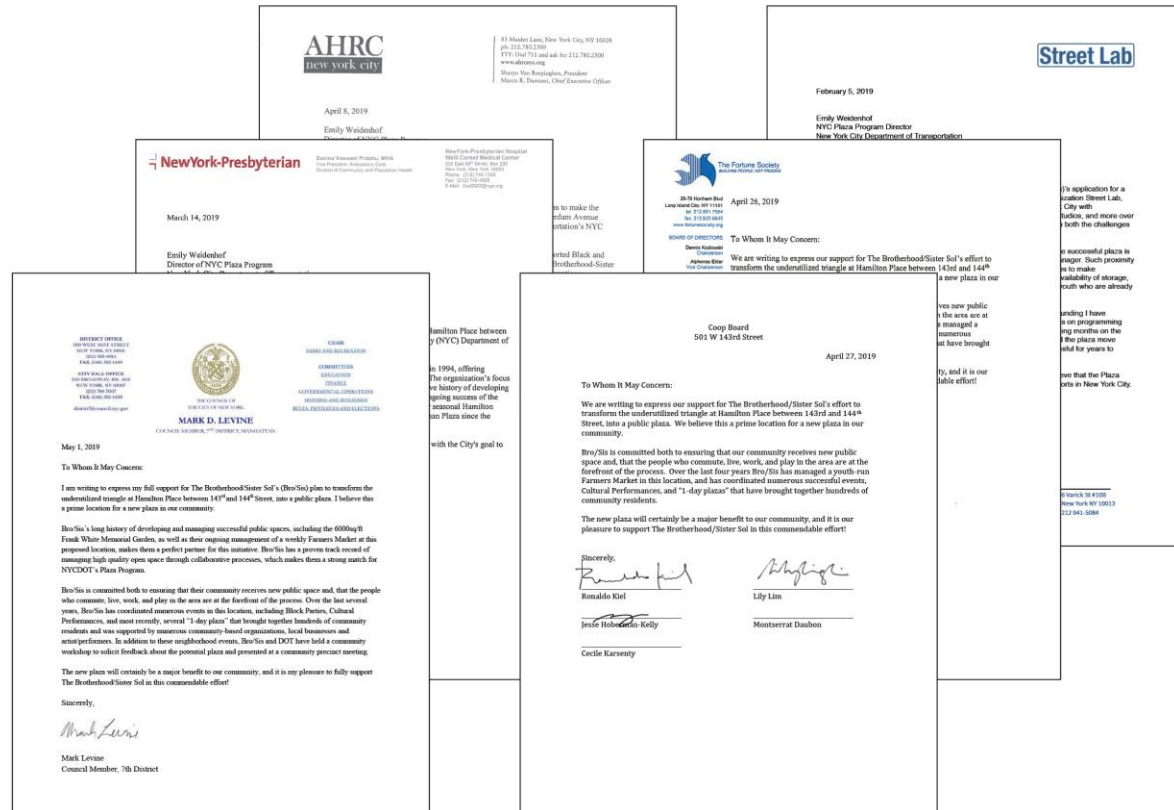
- Participants were excited about the safety benefits

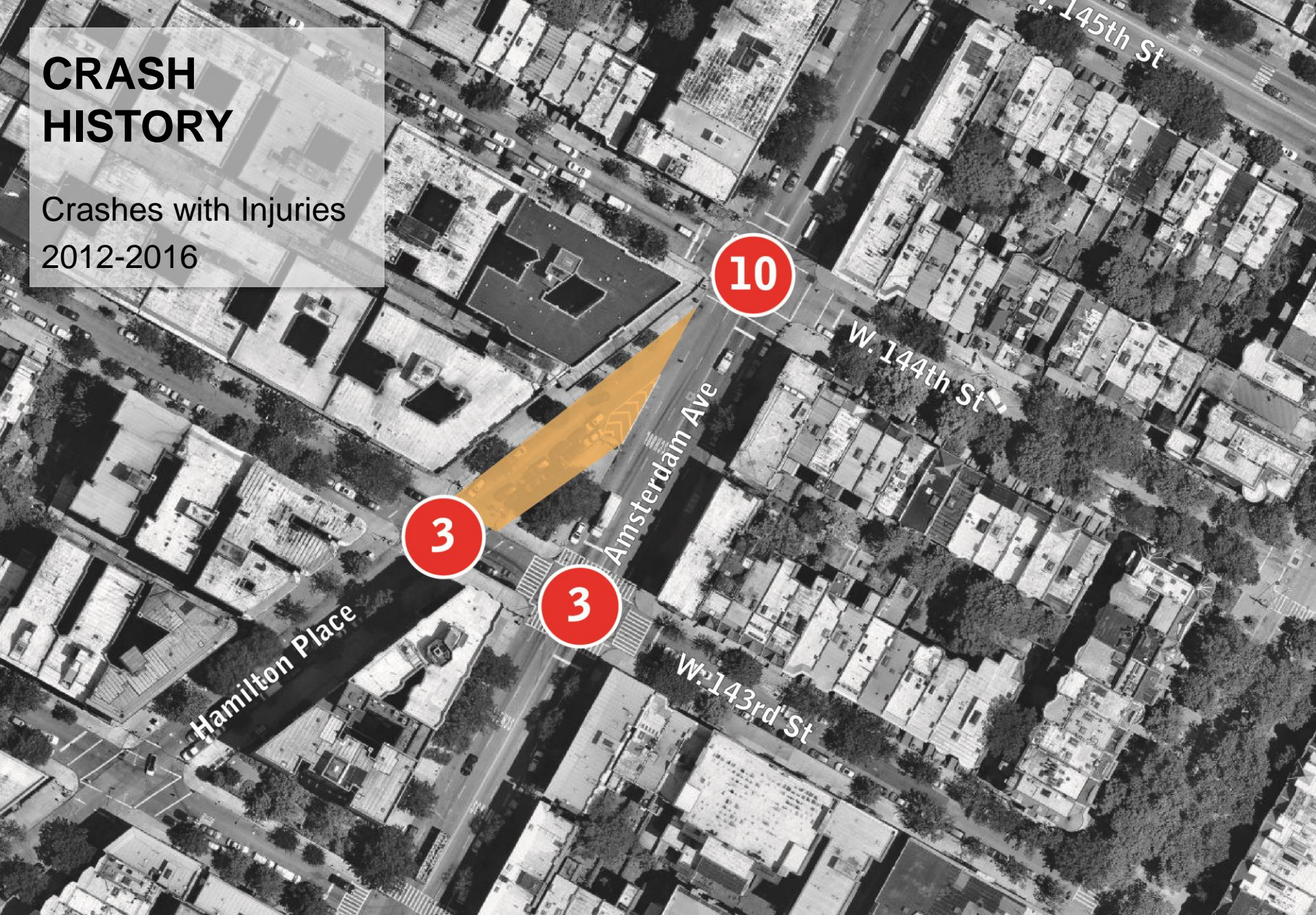

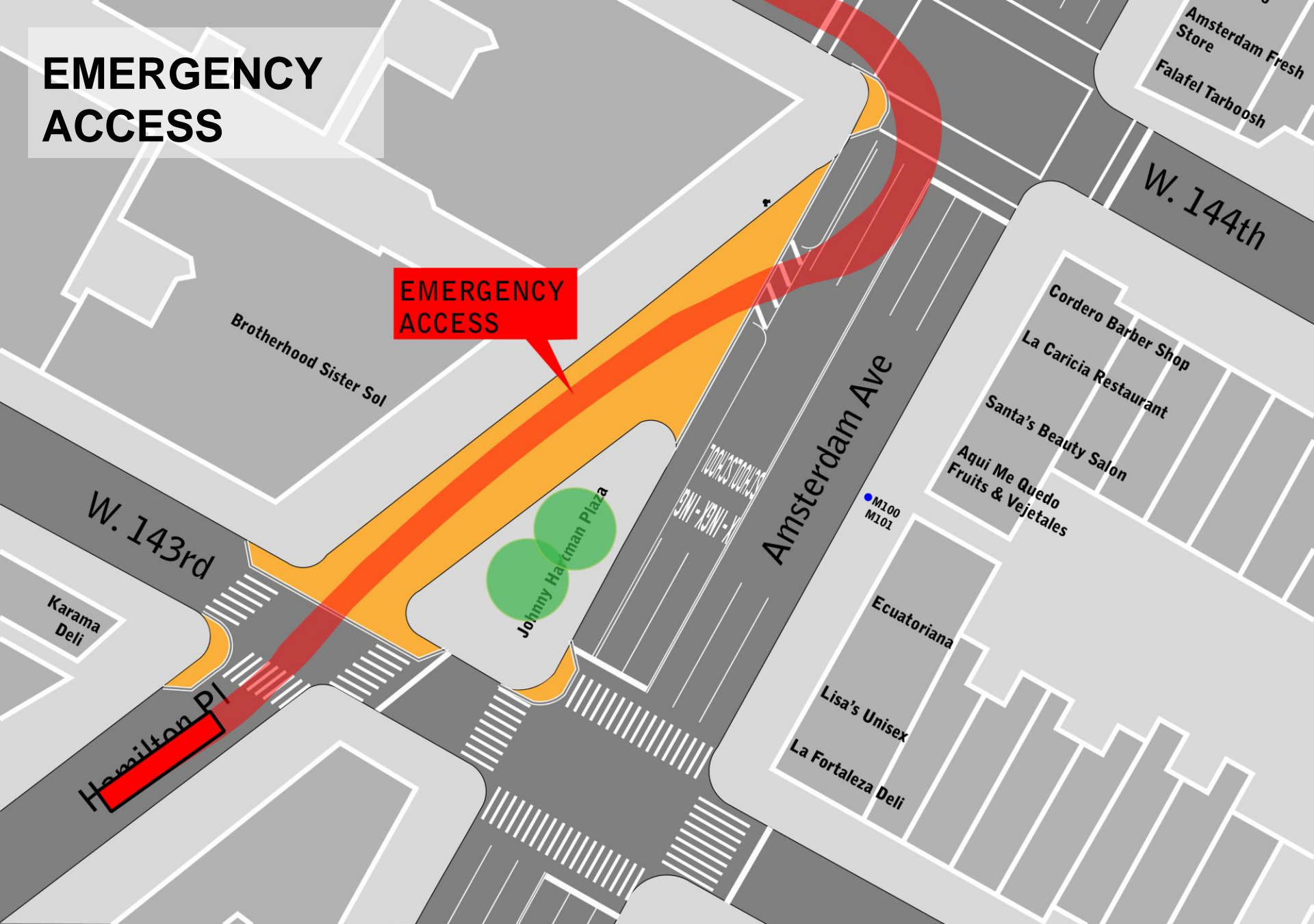

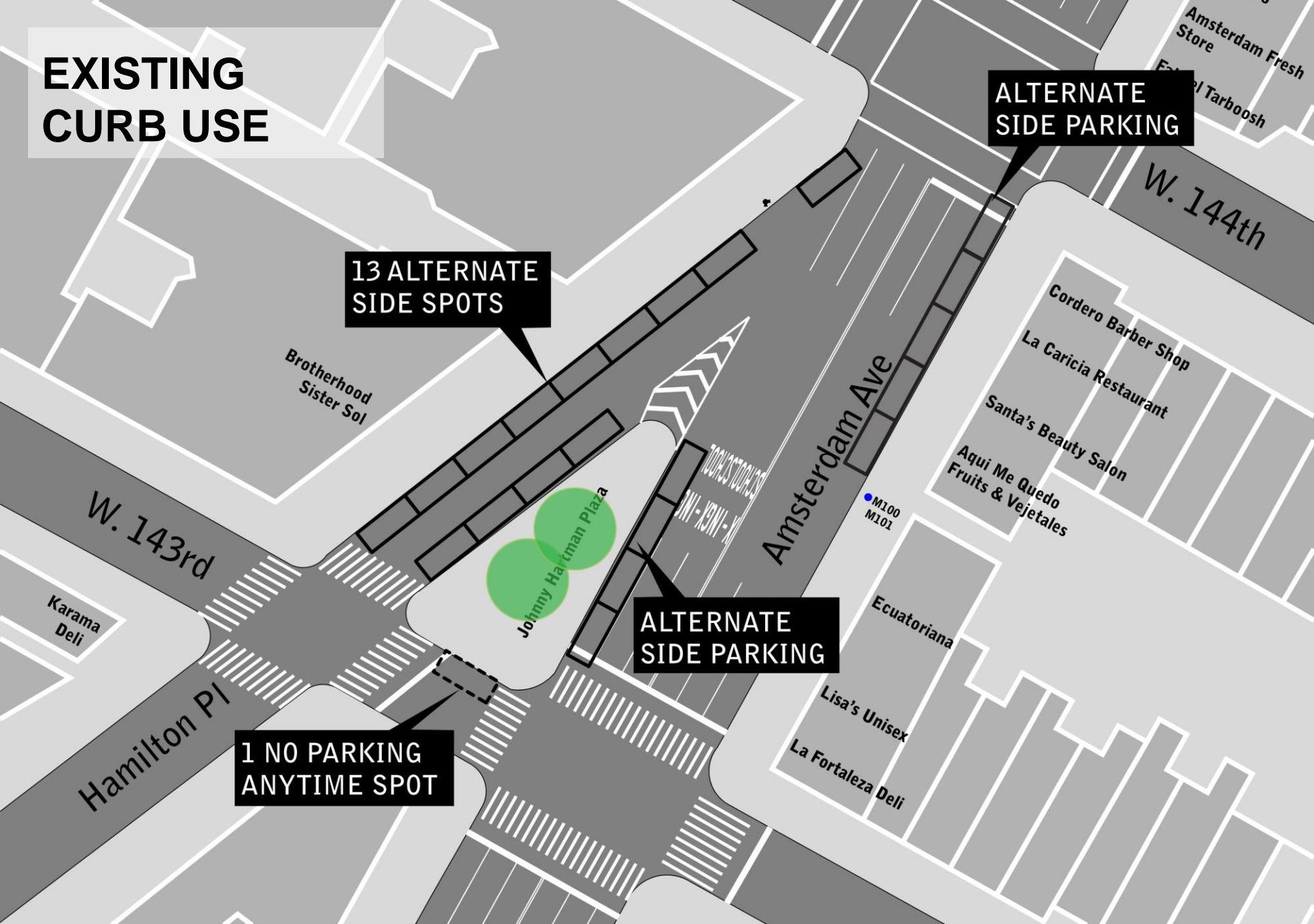
