Programming Partner List! NYC DOT's Programming initiative brings a wide variety of activities and events to public spaces across the city including Open Streets and pedestrian plazas. Through arts, culture, fitness, active transportation, and educational programming, we aim to promote the positive use of public space. With a focus on offering experiences to communities in need, this initiative supports neighborhoods in NYC DOT Priority Investment and Public Space Priority Areas, as identified in the NYC Streets Plan. This resource is a procurement tool for organizations who operate in public spaces to find and connect with programming partners for the purpose of activating the spaces they manage with enriching and inclusive offerings.

The organizations included on this list responded to a request for proposals released in November of 2023. The request called for organizations who could provide free and accessible programming for New Yorkers of all ages and abilities to DOT-owned public spaces. Proposals were reviewed by a committee of qualified professionals who considered organizational experience, capacity, and quality of the programming in making their determinations. **Considerations:** 3AM Theatre currently has their own rehearsal space, cargo van for transport, all lighting and sound equipment, technical crew, and roster of artists available to perform the show. They operate in warmer seasons between April and October.

**Programming Description:** Popup Opera - Opera favorites, i.e. Nessun Dorma, O Sole Mio, Brindisi, etc. Angelitos Negros - Black and Hispanic songs and opera in Spanish and English. Combines social justice themes with thrilling voices for audiences of all ages and backgrounds.

**Considerations:** Electricity or a generator, stage or performance area, on-site audio technician or DJ, sound system, auxiliary cords, vocal/instrument microphones, microphone stands, audience chairs or seating area, 10x10 tent in inclement weather. They offer year-round programming.

**Considerations:** They will need a power source to plug in all sound systems. They are looking to offer pop-up programming all summer long from May - September.

**Considerations:** They need a proper space to perform. All instruments are acoustic or have battery-powered amps (respecting volume rules). They perform all year long.

**Programming Description:** Artesanias Mexicanas focuses on maintaining traditional craft such as pinatas, paper flowers, clay alebrijes, and paper mâché masks teaching the culture and history behind the activity. They also do more modern bracelet and slime making classes.

**Considerations:** They have worked on Open Streets and understand the constraints. They appreciate the use of a table, but can supply them if required. They can work year round, but it must be slightly warm for pinata making for the glue to set.

**Considerations:** They only need an open space to perform. They can tailor the performance to large or small spaces. If access to a power source is available, they will use recorded music and live drumming. If not, they can do the performance with solely live drummers. They are flexible, available all seasons, primarily April through October.

**Considerations:** No resources required. They generally operate without electricity. For drumming workshops, they would need at least 10 chairs to be provided. They operate April 1 through November 30.

**Considerations:** No Limitations. All acoustic, but they can provide small amplified sound systems (battery-powered) if needed. Available all seasons, indoors or out.

**Considerations:** 32 Foot Projector Screen (Inflatable), 4k Projector, 4-6 Work lights, Generator, Electricity (Outlets), 2-4 Speakers to amplify audio for movie experience, Stage/ Riser for Performances, 200 Chairs, Tables, 4 Portable Bathrooms + Wash Stations. They only offer programming during the warmer seasons, between May & October.

The time of year will depend on if their professional dancers and/or students are available to perform.

They prefer a sound system is provided, particularly for outdoor events, but this could potentially be provided by the band depending on availability and budget. They operate year-round. Their schedule is flexible, as long as the location can accommodate the musicians and instruments safely and comfortably.

**Considerations:** They can perform indoors or outdoors. They can provide amplification and backline if need be, but it is preferred if gear is already on site. They need electricity if the expected crowd or space is large, unless intimate acoustics are preferred. They are available year-round. Summer is preferable.
