












What is Allowed on the Staten Island Ferry?

Guide for E-bikes & Mobility Devices*

Effective November 1, 2021

- Charging of any **E-bike or other mobility device** (lithium) battery is prohibited onboard the Ferry
- Bicycles and Class 1-3 e-bikes are permitted onboard the Ferry
- Mobility devices identified below **as requiring** an operator's license, operator's license endorsement, vehicle registration or license plates are not permitted on the Ferry

E-Bike Class 3 	Electric Bike , Throttle up to 25 MPH, Operable Pedals	25 MPH	No	No	Yes	
E-Scooters 	Device with handlebars, a floorboard or seat, weighing < 100 lbs, Can be powered by electric and/or human power	15 MPH	No	No	Yes	Segway 
Moped Class C 	Limited Use Motorcycle , Low-speed, 2-3 Wheels	20 MPH	Yes, Driver's License	Yes, must be registered with NYS DMV, must have license plates & VINs	No	Hoverboard 
Moped Class B 	Limited Use Motorcycle , Low-speed, 2-3 Wheels	30 MPH	Yes, Driver's License	Yes, must be registered with NYS DMV, must have license plates & VINs	No	Electric unicycle (two types) 
Moped Class A 	Limited Use Motorcycle , Low-speed, 2-3 Wheels	40 MPH	Yes, Driver's License Endorsement	Yes, must be registered with NYS DMV, must have license plates & VINs	No
