## ALL EMPLOYEES ARE REQUIRED TO TAKE FLU VACCINE

There is the probability that both seasonal flu and the H1N1 virus will make the upcoming flu season more serious than usual given the transmission of flu between patients and employees. The NYS Dept of Health has issued mandatory new regulations that require all healthcare workers, whatever their job, to receive both seasonal and H1N1 influenza vaccinations.

Flu immunization is now a condition of employment, similar to TB testing (PPD), measles and rubella vaccine. Employees must be vaccinated by November 30, 2009.
