Dec 6th 2012 – In keeping with longstanding tradition, Jacobi Medical Center (Jacobi) and the North Central Bronx Hospital (NCBH) celebrated their annual recognition and awards ceremony paying tribute to the extraordinary dedication, achievement, and commitment of the staff from each institution. Both institutions comprise the North Bronx Healthcare Network (the Network). The event was held at the Villa Barone Manor, located in the Throggs Neck community of the Bronx, New York. This year, a theme of the Renaissance was selected in order to honor the creative and innovative methods staff members take to improve the healthcare their patients receive. The event is the signature fundraiser for both hospitals' auxiliaries. The Auxiliaries are non-profit volunteer organizations that support and enhance patient care by raising funds for much needed programs and assistance, which cannot be supported through regular hospital resources.

This year's honorees included **Harry M. Delany, MD, FACS** who was recognized with a Lifetime Achievement Award for his half century of exemplary service as a surgeon, his many years with the Network and as a professor at the Albert Einstein College of Medicine. Dr. Delany, a Harlem native and current Mount Vernon resident, became the first Director of Surgery at North Central Bronx Hospital in 1976; he was appointed to the same position at Jacobi (then Bronx Municipal Hospital Center) in 1986. When the hospitals joined to form the North Bronx Healthcare Network in 1996, Dr. Delany became Chairman of the Departments of Surgery for both hospitals. Some of his medical accomplishments include the Needle Catheter Jejunostomy, a tool for feeding post-operative patients, a procedure that is used worldwide. He also patented the Duodenal Intubation Catheter, which is used to feed and also decompress the duodenum within the small intestine. During the ceremony there was a surprise announcement by Senior Vice President **William P. Walsh** that the Board of the New York City Health and Hospitals Corporation had passed a resolution that the recently renovated Surgery Department of Jacobi would be named in his honor. This news led to a standing ovation by all in attendance.
