

 A classification framework for organizing the Client and Community Services delivered in the City of New York

How will the CCS Catalog be used in the HHS Accelerator Application?


- By City Agencies to describe service capability qualifications for upcoming solicitations in the Procurement Roadmap
- **By Providers** to describe the services they offer in the HHS Accelerator Application in order to receive RFPs and learn about related service areas
- By HHS Accelerator and Agencies to create targeted RFP distribution lists of qualified providers

What are the benefits of using the CCS Catalog?


- Provides a common terminology to describe programs, services and client populations
- Exposure to related service areas and new opportunities for providers
- Targeted RFP distribution lists for Agencies
- Meaningful data analysis for program mapping and potential partnerships




Why is the CCS Catalog Needed?

CCS Catalog Structure




Item	Definition
Service Area	A grouping of service activities that is defined by particular client issues, disciplines and/or professional groups (e.g. Foster Care or Workforce Development)
Functions	An area of activity that is not specific to particular client issues, discipline or professional group by being either: • A cross-cutting aspect of HHS practice • An activity that is not specific to HHS (e.g. Case Management/Facility Management)
Populations	A group of HHS clients defined by a particular population characteristic that has relevance to or determines eligibility for the delivery of service (e.g. Age, Gender, Health Status)
Geography	Geographic location in which services/functions are provided (e.g. All NYC, Borough)
Languages	Languages in which organizations have the capacity to provide services and communicate with clients
Service Setting	Type of physical setting in which services are provided (e.g. Home-based, Community Center)


CCS Catalog Structure and Use

Each element of the CCS Catalog is discrete/mutually exclusive Service Areas and Functions are activity-based and are program-, population-, and outcomes-agnostic to exclusively describe the service delivered ☐ Populations, Geography, Languages and Service Setting serve as modifiers to Service Areas and Functions to more specifically describe activities/services delivered Elements should not combine services with modifiers from other parts of the CCS Catalog (e.g. domestic violence shelter – domestic violence survivor is the population and shelter is the service element) Elements should not be synonymous with programs unless the program conforms to the above principles ☐ HHS Accelerator Application requires providers to submit supporting documentation for Service Areas and Functions; Agencies use these qualifications to create solicitation distribution lists and to describe programs in Procurement Roadmap Modifier elements are self-selected by providers to describe their specializations in the **HHS Accelerator Application** Additional qualifications specified by Agencies at solicitation and evaluated at proposal All elements of CCS Catalog will be used for mapping and data analysis at award.




HHS Accelerator Business Application Screen Mock-up: BASICS - Questions




HHS Accelerator Business Application Screen Mock-up: BASICS - Geography




HHS Accelerator Business Application BASICS - Languages




HHS Accelerator Business Application Screen Mock-up: BASICS - Populations




HHS Accelerator Services Application Screen Mock-up: - Index and Search

CCS Catalog and the Procurement Process



Program Example: <u>DYCD – Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP)</u>

- The branches of the CCS Catalog contain activity-based service elements and modifying elements that are population-, geography-, language-, and setting-specific
- Unique combinations of services and their modifiers across all CCS Catalog branches make up the range of human service programs delivered in NYC
- Providers will only have to identify the services they provide to receive solicitations; service modifiers and program nuances will be specified in Agency RFPs
- At award, the City will record more detailed information about services for data analysis

CCS Catalog – Governance Model

Changes to the CCS Catalog- The principles used to determine whether a suggested CCS Catalog element should be added include:

- Elements should be discrete/mutually exclusive where necessary they should include connections to other elements
- Elements should share the characteristics of parent elements
- Elements should be activity based and focused on actual activities
- Elements should avoid including modifiers from other parts of the CCS Catalog (e.g. domestic violence shelter—domestic violence survivor is the population and shelter is the service element)
- Whenever possible elements should align with New York State and Federal funding streams and programs
- Elements should not be synonymous with programs unless the program conforms to the above principles.

Change Control Process-

- WHO By an Agency, HHS Accelerator or Oversight
- HOW Through formal submission process (ability to provide a standard description as outlined above as well as a justification based on the principles delineated above)
- WHEN For any changes new elements, modification of elements, removal and or consolidation of existing elements, changes to existing descriptions and or connections to other elements.

STEPS -


- HHS Accelerator managed CCS Catalog submission review team made up of Subject Matter Experts ("CCS Catalog Committee") would review submissions and liaise with submitting agency staff
- CCS Catalog Committee would vote on suggestion
- Submit to ESC for final sign off.

Responsibilities of HHS Accelerator Unit-

- Regular publication on website of the CCS Catalog including summary of any changes
- Training for Agency staff.

Funding Stream Optimization

 All funding streams to be defined in terms of CCS Catalog elements to allow for identification of opportunities to utilize funding streams across programs and to increase funding

Service Gap Identification

 CCS Catalog will allow for geographic and service mapping across programs to identify where services can be enhanced to improve access and effectiveness

Coordinated Provider Support

HHS Accelerator Application process will identify where in the CCS Catalog there
are many providers and where the City should invest in encouraging the
development of provider capabilities

Integration with HHS Accelerator Data

 HHS performance metrics will be mapped to the CCS Catalog to provide enhanced performance focus at key points in the CCS Catalog

Enhance opportunities for cross-agency collaboration by designing programs to meet needs using elements across the CCS Catalog.
