**ALTERNATE SIDE PARKING RULES SUSPENSION CALENDAR** The City suspends alternate side parking regulations on 37 legal and religious holidays. This includes three dates in June 2011: 6/2 (Thu.), 6/8 (Wed.), 6/9 (Thu.).

New York City's first official **PRESCRIPTION DRUG DISCOUNT CARD**, *BigAppleRx*. This card is free and available to anyone in New York City regardless of age, income, citizenship or health insurance status. *BigAppleRx* will be accepted at more than 2,000 city pharmacies, and may be used by anyone who lives, works or visits the City. Card users will save an average of 47 percent on prescription medications. Contact [www.nyc.gov](http://www.nyc.gov) and instantly download and print the card, access educational information about prescriptions, compare drug prices and locate the nearest participating pharmacies. HealthTrans Access – one of the nation's largest discount drug programs – will assist the City in administering program.

**FREE LEGAL SERVICE FOR IMMIGRATION** related issues. You can make a private appointment with lawyers. Appointments are required. You must live on the west side of Manhattan between Canal Street and 110th Street and be income eligible for the services. Spanish translation is provided. **FREE LEGAL CLINIC.** Housing Conservation Coordinators offers a free legal clinic every Monday night (except on holidays) from at 7:00-9:00pm. Visitors must call the front desk to reserve a spot. Only the first eight callers will be able to reserve an appointment. Those eight reserved spots will be seen on a first-come, first-served basis during the night of the clinic.
