



FDNY 2009 Service Highlights



- Over 20,000 fire safety presentations reached 1.5 million New Yorkers over the past three years
- Written fire safety materials in 10 different languages, including Spanish, Urdu and Russian
- FDNY and FDNY Foundation distributed 12,000 smoke alarms and 75,000 batteries in all five boroughs last year

FDNY 2009 Service Highlights



2009 Fire deaths a historic low

73 civilians last year, a 15 percent drop from 2008; previous low was 77 in 1919

Fastest fire response times on record

4:02 last year; significantly lower than the previous five-year average of 4:25

Fewer fires than ever before

Serious fires down to 2,485 – a 20% reduction from 1996-2007 average of 3,200


FDNY 2009 Service Highlights



- Space heaters should be on a flat surface at least three feet from anything that can burn and should always be turned off when leaving a room or going to sleep.
- Never use an extension cord with a space heater; it should be plugged directly into an outlet.
- Never use a space heater with a frayed or damaged cord.
- Install smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors. If you already have detectors installed, make sure you test them at least once a month.
- Never use the kitchen oven or gas range to heat your home or apartment. This could lead to an accumulation of dangerous levels for carbon monoxide.
- Use electric blankets only if they have the Underwriters Laboratories (UL) Mark and are less than 10 years old. Blankets that are 10 years or older account for 99% of all electric blanket fires.
- Call 311 to report lack of heat or hot water in your apartment or home.
