BIC COVID-19 NOTIFICATION #7

To all licensees and registrants:

As noted in BIC COVID-19 Notification #6, dated April 16, 2020, New York State Governor Andrew M. Cuomo's Executive Order (EO) 202.17 (issued on April 15, 2020) requires, among other things, all New Yorkers to wear a mask or a face covering when in a public place and unable to maintain, or when not maintaining, social distancing. That requirement goes into effect today, April 17, 2020, at 8:00pm.

Yesterday, Governor Cuomo issued EO 202.18, extending the "NYS on Pause" order (which includes the closing of non-essential businesses and gatherings) through May 15, 2020. EO 202.18 also requires, among other things, the wearing of a mask or face covering when on public transportation or in for-hire vehicles. That requirement goes into effect today (April 17, 2020) at 8:00pm.
