This new sentencing grid is designed around a 30 day maximum sentence. No sentences longer than 30 days have been levied this reporting period.
(iv)	the status of implementation of the Department's planned policy to require that an inmate be released from punitive segregation for a minimum of seven (7) days before returning to punitive segregation	Counting for the 30 day length of stay limit began when the new rules went into effect on February 21. All inmates who were in punitive segregation on that date were released on or before March 23. From that time on, all inmates who serve 30 consecutive days are released for at least seven days before they may return to punitive segregation.
(v)	a plan and timeline detailing steps necessary to reduce the length of punitive segregation sentences and to reduce the number of inmates housed in punitive segregation	Punitive segregation sentences have been reduced to a maximum of 30 days. The punitive segregation census has dropped significantly. It was more than 50% lower on July 31 than it was on February 20, the day before the rule went into effect. The use of segregation will be further reduced when use is prohibited for young adult inmates early next year. Additionally, DOC has partnered with the Vera Institute of Justice to develop safe alternatives to segregation. This nearly two year project includes a year of policy and procedure assessment before reforms are recommended and implemented. DOC will share any recommendations with the Board when they are issued next year.
