

Young Adult Housing Monthly Progress Report July 2018

Important Note Regarding This Month's Report:

The New York City Department of Correction closed the George Motchan Detention Center (GMDC) on June 30th, 2018 as an initial phase in New York City's plan to move to borough-based facilities. The Department, in cooperation with the Board of Correction, will adapt the format of the Young Adult Housing Monthly Progress Report to align with housing and Custody Management plans for young adults in Department custody. Due to the timing of both the variance for which this report is required and the closure of GMDC, this month's report is in the original reporting format and therefore presents a snapshot of young adult housing on the first of this month.

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3. Staff Training

- Safe Crisis Management
 - Number/Percent received (GMDC) – 30/85.7%
 - Number/Percent received (Department-wide) – 6382/60.54%
 - Number/Percent current (GMDC) – 14/40.0%
 - Number/Percent current (Department-wide) – 2724/25.84%

- Specialized Training - For its specialized housing units (Second Chance, TRU, and Secure), DOC will be providing additional training to include the following:
 - 2-day collaborative training (DOC and H&H) – focusing on DOC programming strategy, 14-point agenda, youth development, trauma, behavior modification principles, and unit protocols:
 - The 2-day training was not offered in June, as staff assignments are still being solidified in the wake of GMDC’s closure. New dates will be scheduled to resume the training to support the YA TRU and SCH units’ transition to RNDC when staff assignments are solidified. Additionally, program refinement within ESH has been taking place over the past few months, particularly in regards to improvement of the review process and program offerings. These elements will need to be completed and incorporated into the 2-day training before it resumes.
 - 1-day overview of Dialectical Behavior Therapy and programming strategies:
 - The training has been postponed and the Department is evaluating how to integrate DBT overview and programming strategies into the 2-day training.

The Department will begin providing these trainings to young adult-only ESH housing units after they have been implemented in Second Chance, TRU, and Secure.
