What he did was took a group of these kids counseling and speaking to them and now they have a play that's playing on Broadway you see the signs up on 42nd Street where they're having these plays he came back to the community visit the schools and they have a school that they're renaming after him they made pictures of sneakers and they posted it up in their cafeteria on behalf of Robert Carter.

Also, Robert Carter again he came back to the community even in his death he's giving out things. Madison Square Garden gives out tickets to his mother where she can continue giving tickets inside and outside the community where we get front row seats for Radio City Music Hall we've seen the Rockettes, and we just had a Robert Carter High School Basketball Game Saturday in reference to stop the violence.
