

Temporary Closure of Bruckner Boulevard Service Road between Third and Lincoln Avenue Notice of Public Forum

Triton Construction Company is applying for a temporary closure of the segment of the Bruckner Boulevard Service Road located between Third Avenue and Lincoln Avenue in the Mott Haven neighborhood of Bronx Community District 1. The temporary street closure would facilitate construction on the adjacent 101 Lincoln Avenue development site, by allowing the street segment to be used for staging construction materials and equipment and for deliveries.

A Community Reassessment, Impact and Amelioration (CRIA) Statement has been prepared to analyze the temporary closure of this street segment. The temporary closure would last approximately 30 months.

By law, all street closures lasting longer than 180 days require a public forum to be followed by a CRIA Statement or Environmental Assessment Statement (EAS) incorporating any public comments and responses. As part of the CRIA Statement, a study was prepared in coordination with the NYC Department of Transportation on the temporary closure. At this forum, results of the study will be presented. Members of the public are invited to attend and will be given the opportunity to make comments. This forum complies with Local Law 24 of 2005, (Title 34, Chapter 2, Section 2-16 of the Rules of the City of New York). In support of the City's efforts to contain the spread of COVID-19, the public forum will be held remotely.
