Demand for meals as well as safety challenges have led to special procedures such as Grab & Go meals, distribution via a van instead of the larger Food Service Angelmobile Truck. Just recently, the Angels have begun a collaboration with Jimmy's Diner on Union Avenue, to distribute a meal to every shift working at Woodhull Hospital. Volunteers shuttle 300 meals a day to the Heroic Healthcare workers.
