**Description:** CookSafe model CV, is a patented combination hood with integrated fire system that monitors heat through a patented sequence of sensors that (1) turns on fan to high position if not on already at 1<sup>st</sup> set temperature (2) sounds a local and/or remote alarm, along with shutting down the stove at 2<sup>nd</sup> higher set temperature and (3) releases a fire suppressant liquid chemical at the last higher set temperature resulting from a cooking fire, as well as shutting off the gas or electricity to the stove.

**Terms and Conditions:** The above-described electric heating cabinets are accepted under the following conditions:

1. Units shall be installed in accordance with manufacturer's instructions and New York City Electrical, Building and Fire codes.

- 2. Installation shall not obstruct access for operation and servicing.
- 3. Approval of all electrical equipment, apparatus, materials and devices shall be obtained from the Department's Electrical Division.
- 4. Units shall be used in compliance with the Energy Conservation Construction Code of New York State.
- 5. All shipments and deliveries of such equipment shall be provided with a metal tag, suitably placed, certifying that the equipment shipped or delivered is equivalent to that tested and accepted for use, as provided in Section 27-131 of the New York City Building Code.
