**Description:** SupexBond 3-in1 system wood flooring underlayment, combining the flooring adhesive, a membrane for sound reduction and vapour barrier. The two products are mixed directly on the substrate and laid out with a 3/16" V-notch trowel. The flooring can be applied directly on the top of mixture.

Flame Spread Rating - 35

Smoke Developed Rating - 85

**Terms and Conditions:** The above-described material is accepted for use as underlayment for finish flooring under the following conditions:

1. The material may be used when a Class "B" flame-spread rating is required.
2. The material shall be used with wood flooring.

3. The material shall be used in accordance with the New York City Building Code.
4. All shipments and deliveries of such material shall be provided with a label, suitably placed, certifying that the material shipped or delivered is equivalent to that tested and accepted for use, as provided in Section 27-131 of the New York Building Code.

Note: In accordance with Section 27-131(d), all materials tested and accepted for use shall be subject to periodic retesting as determined by the Commissioner and any material which upon retesting is found not to comply with Code requirements or the requirements set forth in the approval of the Commissioner shall cease to be acceptable for the use intended. During the period for such retesting, the Commissioner may require the use of such material to be restricted or discontinued if necessary to secure safety.
