DCWP RULES HEARING - TOW AND BOOTING PENALTY SCHEDULE

VIRTUAL PUBLIC HEARING

REMOTE - VIA TELECONFERENCE

March 11, 2024

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MS. KARLINE JUNG: Okay, I'll get started.

So, good morning. My name is Karline Jung. I've been designated as the Hearing Officer for the public hearing of the Department of Consumer and Worker Protection on the proposed rules to amend the penalty schedules concerning the towing of vehicles and booting of motor vehicles. This hearing is being held by teleconference call. It is now 11:03 a.m. on Monday, March 11, 2024, and I'm hereby convening the public hearing on this proposed rule.

The proposed rule was published in The City Record on February 8, 2024. The published notice and rules are available online on the NYC Rules website and the Department's website. The Department has proposed these rules pursuant to the authority vested in the Commissioner of the Department of Consumer and Worker Protection by sections 1043 and 2203(f) and 2203(h)(1) of the New York City Charter, and sections 19-169(b), 19-169.1(m), and 19-169.2(k) of the New York City Administrative Code.

This hearing affords the public the opportunity to comment on all aspects of the rule the Department has proposed. The Department will carefully review all testimony and written comments received at this hearing, and will give due weight and

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consideration to proposals and recommendations that are submitted for the record at this hearing.

To ensure everyone seeking to testify will have an opportunity to do so, I ask that we follow these ground rules. During the hearing, all participants should give due respect and consideration to the folks offering their testimony, and please mute your lines if you're not speaking. Each witness will have a maximum of three minutes to provide oral testimony. If your comments take longer than three minutes, please synthesize your oral testimony and leave a written copy for the record. Unlike the limit on the time for oral testimony, there is no limit on the number of pages you can submit as written testimony or as documents for the record. The written submission will be part -- will be made part of the public record.

If you are looking to testify today and you have not yet let me know, please let me know. Yes, Zach Miller, you may testify whenever you're ready.

MR. ZACH MILLER: Thanks. Can you hear me?
MS. JUNG: Yeah, I can hear you.

MR. MILLER: Great. Good morning, and thank you for the opportunity to share testimony. My name is Zach Miller. I am the Director of Metro Region

Operations for the Trucking Association of New York.

Last month, the Federal Motor Carrier Safety

Administration (FMCSA) issued comments outlining

concerns with predatory towing junk fee practices that

significantly increase costs for commercial motor

vehicle owners and operators. The comment also offers

support for the proposed ban on hidden and misleading

fees and urges the FTC to consider additional

restrictions against the types of unnecessary and

excessive mandatory junk fees plaguing truckers.

Though not directly related, we are glad to see DCWP issue amendments to ensure a towing and booting penalty schedule includes all towing and booting charges for which they are authorized to issue violations, including those on Title 19 of New York City Administrative Code. Since all of New York City is a towaway zone, it is imperative that towing operators follow best practices and procedures. No motorist should be taken advantage of. It is our hope that this amended penalty schedule will ensure that.

As always, the Trucking Association of New York looks forward to ongoing collaboration and dialogue with the Department of Consumer and Worker Protection. Thank you for your time.
