The process removes redundancy by capturing information about boards, filings, policies, and general service experience centrally. OATH has a current contract with SecureWatch24, Inc., covering all the five (5) borough office locations for the installation of security equipment, integration and centralization of independent security systems, as well as the maintenance of the entire Genetec security infrastructure. The servers of the unified Genetec security infrastructure, at the Long Island City office location had reached their end of life and support since last January 2020.
