

On behalf of THE CITY COUNCIL NOTICE OF A PUBLIC HEARING

The City Council, by resolution adopted on October 23, 2008, set November 13, 2008 as the date, 11:00 A.M. as the time, and the City Council Committee Room, 2nd Floor, City Hall, New York, New York 10007, as the place for a public hearing (the "Public Hearing") to hear all persons interested in the proposed legislation which would establish the Fulton Street Business Improvement District (the "District") in the Borough of Brooklyn. The District shall be established in accordance with a district plan (the "District Plan") on file at the Office of the City Clerk. The City Council has authorized the New York City Department of Small Business Services to publish, on its behalf, this notice of the Public Hearing containing the information required by Section 25-406(c) of the Administrative Code of the City of New York and summarizing the resolution adopted.

The District Plan was submitted to, and reviewed by, the City Planning Commission and Brooklyn Community Board Number 2. The Community Board and the City Planning Commission have approved the District Plan.

The District Plan provides that the proposed District shall generally include properties on the north side of Fulton Street from Rockwell Place to Classon Avenue and the south side of Fulton Street from Ashland Place to Classon Avenue. Services to be provided in the District shall include, but not be limited to sanitation, marketing and promotion, holiday lighting, public safety, beautification, administration of the District and additional services required for the enjoyment and protection of the public and the promotion and enhancement of the District (hereinafter "Services") Pursuant to the District Plan, capital improvements (hereinafter "Improvements") may include, but shall not limited to: sidewalk amenities to identify, enhance and beautify the District; sidewalk plantings, sidewalk logos/ plagues, kiosks, street identification, and pedestrian crossing enhancements. The Improvements shall be implemented on an as-needed basis. During the existence of the BID, the maximum cost of the Improvements, if any, shall not exceed \$3,000,000. The District shall be managed by the Fulton Street District Management Association, Inc.

To defray the cost of Services and Improvements provided in the District, all real property in the District shall be assessed in proportion to the benefit such property receives from the Services and Improvements. Each property shall be assessed at a rate, determined annually by the Fulton Street District Management Association, Inc., to yield an amount sufficient to meet the District's annual budget. The annual budget for the District's first year of operation is \$300,000.

Those properties within the District which are devoted in whole or in part to commercial and/or mixed uses and vacant land with commercial zoning overlays shall constitute Class A properties and shall be assessed in accordance with the following formula:

(Corner properties will be assessed an additional \$120 per year. If a corner property has a separate storefront on the side street, the additional storefront will be charged per linear foot as other Class A properties.)

Those properties within the District which are devoted in whole to residential uses shall constitute Class B properties and shall be assessed at one dollar (\$1.00) per year.

All government and not-for-profit properties devoted in whole to public or not-for-profit use shall constitute class C property and be exempt from district assessment. Government or not-for-profit owned property devoted in part to commercial or for-profit uses shall constitute class A property and the portion of the property devoted to commercial/for-profit uses

shall be assessed in the same manner as those properties listed in class A.

The amount, exclusive of debt service, assessed and levied in any given year against benefited real property within the District may not exceed twenty percent (20%) of the total general City taxes levied in such year against such properties.

Copies of the resolution adopted by the City Council, which include a copy of the District Plan, are available for public inspection from 9:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. Monday through Friday at the Office of the City Clerk located at 265 Municipal Building (South Side), One Centre Street, New York, New York 10007. In addition, copies of the resolution are available free of charge to the public at the Office of the City Clerk.

Any owner of real property, deemed benefited and therefore within the District, objecting to the District Plan, must file an objection at the Office of the City Clerk, on forms made available by the City Clerk, within thirty (30) days of the close of the hearing on the proposed District. If owners of at least fifty-one percent (51%) of the assessed value of benefited real property situated within the boundaries of the District proposed for establishment, as shown on the latest completed assessment roll of the City, or at least fifty-one percent (51%) of the owners of benefited real property within the area included in the District proposed for establishment file objections with the City Clerk, the District shall not be established.

(1) the legal business identity, address, license number and telephone number of the principal licensee, as shown on the license issued by this Department;

(2) the name and signature of the person who actually takes the electronic or home appliance into custody;

- (3) a description of the electronic or home appliance, including make, model and serial number, where available, or such other features as will reasonably identify the item accepted for repair;
 - (4) the date the set was accepted for repair;
- (5) the name and address of the owner of the electronic or home appliance;
- (6) a brief description by the customer of the item's malfunction;
- (7) the date or range of dates on which the customer is to receive a Written Estimate, if not already furnished;
- (8) a written schedule of charges, if any, for giving a Written Estimate, pick-up and delivery, service call, storage, installation, and the temporary loan of an electronic or home appliance during the repair of the customer's property, and any other charges; where a licensee's policy is to credit any of the above charges to the final cost of the repair, such credit shall be clearly indicated in computation of the Written

(9) notice that "Pursuant to the Regulations of the Department of Consumer Affairs, your property is covered against loss by fire, [their]theft or damage while in the custody of the service dealer.'

READER'S GUIDE

The City Record (CR) is, published each business day and includes notices of proposed New York City procurement actions, contract awards, and other procurement-related information. Solicitation notices for most procurements valued at or above \$100,000 for information technology and for construction and construction related services, above \$50,000 for other services, and above \$25,000 for other goods are published for at least one day. Other types of procurements, such as sole source, require notice in the City Record for five consecutive days. Unless otherwise specified, the agencies and offices listed are open for business Mondays thru Fridays from 9:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. except legal holidays.

NOTICE TO ALL NEW YORK CITY CONTRACTORS

The New York State Constitution ensures that all laborers. workers or mechanics employed by a contractor or subcontractor doing public work are to be paid the same wage rate that prevails in the trade where the public work is being done. Additionally, New York State Labor Law §§ 220 and 230 provide that a contractor or subcontractor doing public work in construction or building service must pay its employees no less than the prevailing wage. Section 6-109 (the Living Wage Law) of the New York City Administrative Code also provides for a "living wage", as well as prevailing wage, to be paid to workers employed by City contractors in certain occupations. The Comptroller of the City of New York is mandated to enforce prevailing wage. Contact the NYC Comptrollers Office at www.comptroller.nyc.gov, click on Labor Law Schedules to view rates

New York City's "Burma Law" (Local Law No. 33 of 1997) No Longer to be Enforced. In light of the United States Supreme Court's decision in **Crosby v. National Foreign Trade Council**, 530 U.S. 363 (2000), the City has determined that New York City's Local Law No. 33 of 1997 (codified in Administrative Code Section 6-115 and Charter Section 1524), which restricts City business with banks and companies doing business in Burma, is unconstitutional. This is to advise, therefore, that the language relating to Burma contained in existing New York City contracts may not be enforced.

CONSTRUCTION/CONSTRUCTION SERVICES OR CONSTRUCTION RELATED SERVICES

The City of New York is committed to achieving excellence in the design and construction of its capital program, and building on the tradition of innovation in architecture and engineering that has contributed to the City's prestige as a global destination.

VENDOR ENROLLMENT APPLICATION

New York City procures approximately \$7 billion worth of goods, services, construction and construction-related services every year. The NYC Procurement Policy Board Rules require that agencies primarily solicit from established mailing lists called bidder/proposer lists. To register for these lists--free of charge-, prospective suppliers should fill out and submit the NYC-FMS Vendor Enrollment application.

Attention Existing Suppliers:

Even if you already do business with NYC agencies, be sure to fill out an application. We are switching over to citywide, centralized Bidders Lists instead of the agency-specific lists previously used to issue notices about upcoming contract opportunities. To continue receiving notices of New York City contract opportunities, you must fill out and submit a NYC-FMS Vendor Enrollment application.

SELLING TO GOVERNMENT TRAINING WORKSHOP

New and experienced vendors are encouraged to register for a free training course on how to do business with New York City. "Selling to Government" workshops are conducted by the Department of Small Business Services, 110 William Street, New York, NY 10038. PRE-QUALIFIED LIST

New York City procurement policy permits agencies to develop and solicit from pre-qualified lists of vendors, under prescribed circumstance. When it is decided by an agency to develop a pre-qualified list, criteria for pre-qualification must be clearly explained in the solicitation and notice of the opportunity to pre-qualify for that solicitation must be published in at least five issues of the CR.

Information and qualification questionnaires for inclusion on such list may be obtained directly from the Agency Chief Contracting Officer at each agency, (see Vendor Information Manual). A completed qualification Questionnaire may be submitted to the Chief Contracting Officer at any time, unless otherwise indicated and action (approval or denial) shall be taken by the agency within 90 days from the date of submission. Any denial or revocation of pre-qualified status can be appealed to the Office of Administrative Trials and Hearings, (OATH), Section 3-11 of the Procurement Policy Board Rules describes the criteria for the general use of pre-qualified lists.

NON-MAYORAL ENTITIES

The following agencies are not subject to Procurement Policy Board rules and do not follow all of the above procedures: City University, Department of Education, Metropolitan Transportation Authority, Health & Hospitals Corporation, Housing Authority. Suppliers interested in applying for inclusion on bidders list should contact these entities directly (see Vendor Information Manual) at the addresses given.

PUBLIC ACCESS CENTER

The Public Access Center is available to suppliers and the public as a central source for supplier-related information through on-line computer access. The Center is located at 253 Broadway, 9th floor, in lower Manhattan, and is open Monday through Friday from 10:00 A.M to 3:00 P.M. For information, contact the Mayor's Office of Contract Services at (212) 788-0010.

ATTENTION: NEW YORK CITY MINORITY AND WOMEN OWNED BUSINESS ENTERPRISES

Join the growing number of Minority and Women Owned Business Enterprises (M/WBEs) that are competing for New York City's business. In order to become certified for the program, your company must substantiate that it: (1) is at least fifty-one percent (51%) owned, operated and controlled by a minority or woman and (2) is either located in New York City or has a significant tie to New York City's business community. PROMPT PAYMENT

It is the policy of the City of New York to pay its bills promptly. The Procurement Policy Board Rules generally require that the City pay its bills within 30 days after the receipt of a proper invoice. The City now pays interest on all late invoices. The grace period that formerly existed was eliminated on July 1, 2000. However, there are certain types of payments that are not eligible for interest. These are listed in Section 4-06 of the Procurement Policy Board Rules. The Comptroller and OMB determine the interest rate on late payments twice a year, in January and in July.

HOW TO READ CR PROCUREMENT NOTICES

Procurement Notices in the CR are arranged by alphabetically listed Agencies, and within Agency, by Division if any. The notices for each Agency (or Division) are further divided into three subsections: Solicitations, Awards; and Lists & Miscellaneous notices. Each of these subsections separately lists notices pertaining to Goods, Services, or Construction.

Notices of Public Hearings on Contract Awards appear at the end of the Procurement Section. At the end of each Agency (or Division) listing is a paragraph giving the specific address to contact to secure, examine and/or to submit bid or proposal documents, forms, plans, specifications, and other information, as well as where bids will be publicly opened and read. This address should be used for the purpose specified UNLESS a different one is given in the individual notice. In that event, the directions in the individual notice should be followed. The following is a SAMPLE notice and an explanation of the notice format used by the CR.
