The Environmental Control Board (ECB) proposes to amend the Hudson River Park Penalty schedule in Section 3-113 of Subchapter G of Chapter 3 of Title 48 of the Rules of the City of New York (RCNY). The changes are 1) to create penalties for new Hudson River Park rules prohibiting smoking in non-designated areas and prohibiting geocaching without an issued permit, and 2) to amend certain existing penalties related to animals in the park, interfering with trees and vegetation in the park, and boating in the park. These rules create penalties for offenses 1048, and 1049-a of the New York City Charter and Chapter 3 of Title 48 of the RCNY.

## Statement of Basis and Purpose

Pursuant to Sections 533 and 1049-a of the New York City Charter, the New York City Environmental Control Board (ECB) hears and decides Notices of Violation issued for Park Trust relating to the use, government and protection the Hudson River Park.

Sections 1 and 2
The Hudson River Park Trust recently amended the Hudson River Park rules and regulations found in Title 21 of the New York Codes, Rules, and Regulations (NYCRR). These amendments went into effect on April 4, 2013 and included new provisions prohibiting smoking in non-designated areas and geocaching without an issued permit. ECB seeks to amend the Hudson River Park Penalty Schedule found in (RCNY) to create penalties for the violations of these newly added provisions.

Section 751.6(v) of Title 21 of the NYCRR prohibits smoking "in all public areas within Hudson River Park except as may be designated by the trust." In Section 1 of this rulemaking ECB proposes to align the Hudson River Park Penalty Schedule with the New York City Department of Parks and Recreation Rules Penalty Schedule ("Parks Rules Penalty Schedule") found in Section 3-116 of Title 48 of the RCNY by adopting a $\$ 50$ standard penalty and a $\$ 50$ default penalty for violations of Hudson River Park's smoking ban.
Section 751.7(s) of Title 21 of the NYCRR provides that "Geocaching or other treasure hunting games, activities devices, logbooks, trinkets, or other materials, are not allowed within Hudson River Park except as may be expressly permitted by the trust." According to a guidance document Histor by the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation:

Geocaching is an outdoor activity in which the participants use a Global Positioning System (GPS) receiver to place "geocaches" or "caches" and post the GPS coordinates on the internet. Cache-seekers then use their GPS units to locate the site. Some caches are small containers with a variety of items. Visitors to caches can take a few items as souvenirs and leave new items for others to find. Others are virtual caches, where the "treasure" may be simply in the beauty or uniqueness of the site.
Geocaching provides park visitors an opportunity to learn about nature and enjoy the outdoors. Left to damage natural and historic resources and can o damage natural and historic

Any visitor wishing to place a cache must complete an application for a geocache placement permit, which requires review and authorization by the park manager or designee. The permit process will provide for review of all geocache placements to ensure the protection of natural, historic, and archeological resources, and the safety and security of park visitors.
The geocaching restriction was implemented to discourage geocaching without an issued permit, rather than punish the actual offenders. In Section 2, ECB proposes adopting a $\$ 25$ standard penalty and a $\$ 50$ default penalty for violations of the geocaching restriction. These amounts are similar to the Hudson River Park, which were also adopted to discourage the activity rather than punish offenders.

## Sections 3 and 4

Several changes are proposed with the intent of aligning the Hudson River Park Rules Penalty Schedule with the Parks Rules Penalty Schedule found in Section 3-116 of Title 48 of the RCNY where the penalties are for similar offenses. For such changes, where the penalty for a Parks rule violation is greater than $\$ 500$ (the maximum penalty that can be imposed for violation of a Hudson River Park rule), ECB proposes adopting the $\$ 500$ maximum penalty for violations of the similar Hudson River Park rule

Section 751.6(i) of Title 21 of the NYCRR prohibits animals that are "unleashed or out of control in the park." In Section 3, ECB proposes to align the penalties for unleashed or uncontrolled animals in the Hudson River Park Penalty Schedule with the penalties for unleashed or uncontrolled
animals in the Parks Rules Penalty Schedule by adopting $\$ 400$ standard penalty and $\$ 500$ default penalty for a third offense, and the $\$ 500$ maximum penalty for each subsequent offense. Further, by making the $\$ 500$ penalty applicable to fourth and subsequent offenses, there is no need for a separate entry for a fifth offense, which is accordingly being deleted in Section 4
Section $751.6(\mathrm{k})$ of Title 21 of the NYCRR requires the removal of animal waste in Hudson River Park. In Section 3 ECB proposes to align the penalties for failure to remove animal waste in the Hudson River Park Penalty Schedule Parks Rules Penalty Schedule by adopting a $\$ 250$ standard penalty and a $\$ 250$ default penalty for each violation.

Section $751.7(\mathrm{j})$ of Title 21 of the NYCRR prohibits planting pruning, foraging, growing, maintaining, or fertilizing or interfering with any trees, plants, flowers, shrubbery or other vegetation in Hudson River Park. In Section 3, ECB proposes to align the penalties for "planting/pruning/interfering with
tree/vegetation without permit" in the Hudson River Park

Penalty Schedule with the penalties for "destruction of tree branch/pruning without permit/minor tree abuse" in the Parks Rules Penalty Schedule by adopting a $\$ 100$ standard penalty and a $\$ 400$ default penalty for each violation.

The remaining changes in Section 3 deal with various boating restrictions. Since enactment of the current penalty schedule, experience has shown that these penalties are
disproportionate to the risk involved.
In the case of Section 751.8 (f) of Title 21 of the NYCRR, which peed greater than five miles per hour, the current $\$ 50$ peed greater than five miles per hour, the current $\$ 00$ nadequate deterrents. Because the risk of potential harm to ther park users is great if vessels are operated at an xxcessive speed, ECB proposes to raise this penalty to the
$\$ 500$ maximum.

As to the other three boating restrictions, similar to the geocaching restriction above, the intent is to discourage the activity rather than punish offenders. Therefore ECB proposes to lower these penalties by adopting a $\$ 50$ standard penalty and a $\$ 200$ default penalty.

ECB's authority for these rules is found in Sections 533 and 1049-a of the New York City Charter

## Statement of Basis and Purpose of Proposed Rule

The Environmental Control Board (ECB) is proposing to amend section 48 RCNY 3-31(c) of its rules of procedure. The proposed rule clarifies that a single attempt at service of notice of violation may be sufficient to constitute "a reasonable attempt" under Section 1049-a(d)(2)(b) of the New
York City Charter ("Charter"). Section 1049-a does not York City Charter "Charter"). Section 1049-a does not
contain a definition of "reasonable attempt," but ECB contain a definition of reasonable attempt, but ECB However, recent court decisions have created some confusion as to the correct standard. Therefore, ECB is seeking to codify its decisions via rulemaking.

## The Current Rule

ECB's rules of procedure, as found in 48 RCNY 3-31(c), regulate the service of certain notices of violation (NOV). A person accused of violating a provision of the Charter or the City's Administrative Code under ECB's jurisdiction is known as a respondent.

Under Charter section 1049-a(d)(2)(a), an agency typically must serve a NOV to a respondent in the same manner as is prescribed by article three of the Civil Practice Law and Rules or article three of the Business Corporation Law.
However, the Charter also includes a number of exceptions However, the Charter also includes a number of exception
this rule. Section 1049-a(d)(2)(a)(i) allows for service of a NOV by delivering the notice to a person employed by the respondent on or in connection with the premises where the violation occurred. Section 1049-a(d)(2)(a)(ii) allows for service of a NOV issued by the Department of Sanitation, the Department of Buildings, or the Fire Department by affixing such notice in a conspicuous place to the premises where the violation occurred.
Charter section 1049-a(d)(2)(b) provides that sections 1049-$\mathrm{a}(\mathrm{d})(2)(\mathrm{a})(\mathrm{i})$-(ii) only apply after "a reasonable attempt has been made to deliver such notice to a person in such premises upon whom service may be made as provided for by article three of the civil practice law and rules or article three of the business corporation law." The Charter does not contain definition of "reasonable attempt," but ECB has long interpreted the language so that a single attempt could satisfy the requirement. ECB's interpretation is based on the plain language of section 1049-a(d)(2)(b), which requires " $a$, reasonable attempt" (emphasis added), and also the section's legislative history. The State Legislature added section 1049 $\mathrm{a}(\mathrm{d})(2)(\mathrm{b})$ to the Charter with the intent that the new language would eliminate the time-consuming, costly and often unrewarding process now entailed in identifying and locating the person Bill Jo 1979 . Go 623 Th Memorandum on Approval, Bil Jacket, L. 1979, ch. 623. The proposed rule ensures that the legisfative intent behind the creation of section 1049-a(d)(2)(b) is codified in ECB's rules of procedure.

This 11-unit rental building sustained significant storm damage, resulting in 5 units being rendered uninhabitable The proposed repair and mitigation scope includes: repairing the laundry room and common lobby areas; replacing laundry machines, appliances, and other damaged fixtures; adding an additional residential floor on top of the existing structure; a full gut rehabilitation of damaged units, which will involve restructuring the first floor for non-residential use.

## 215 Beach 117th St., Queens

This building has five rental units, one owner-occupied, on not occupied at the time of the storm and that will be not occupied at the time of the storm and that will be reconstituted as storage. Owner has replaced meters, wiring and boiler, and has repaired first-floor units and back porch,

The proposed repair and mitigation scope includes: replacing interior flooring, doors, stairs and exterior fencing, cracked pavement and removal of dead shrubbery; structural damage in the façade and garage need to be repaired, elevator and elevator doors need repair and/or replacement; repainted; first floor radiators, compactor, boiler shell, and repainted; first floor radiators, compactor, boiler shell, and fire escapes. Resilience expenditures include: new high capacity sump pumps and enlarged sump pits, waterproofing capacity sump pumps and enlarged sump pits, waterproofing or relocation of critical panel, compactor rooms, offices, and residential units; generators and emergency lighting; replacement of both the building and garage roof; Metal reglet terminating flashing should be replaced on building and garage roof.

102-00 Shore Front Pkwy, 191 Beach 102 Street, 190 Beach 105 Street, Queens
The property consists of 7 buildings containing an aggregate of 1758 cooperative dwelling units. The flood repair and mitigation scope includes repairs and replacement of affected building systems, including emergency electric service and
breakers, boilers, plumbing, HVAC, and other wet and dry flood proofing, as feasible.

## 301 East 99th Street, Manhattan

Metro East 99 th is a new 10 -story, 176 -unit supportive housing building currently under construction. It is located adjacent to Metropolitan Hospital Campus at 99th Street and 2nd Avenue and will provide permanent supportive housing to patients now living in the soon-to-be-decommissioned Goldwater Hospital on Roosevelt Island. The property is currently $53 \%$ construction complete. In response to Superstorm Sandy, the property implemented mitigation measures to waterproof and elevate the ground floor. The mitigation scope also includes the installation of an emergency generator and all associated electrical components.

## 220 East 7th St., Manhattan

This 15 -unit supportive housing rental building sustaine damage to the elevator during Superstorm Sandy. The elevator controls were housed in the basement, which flooded with approximately 3 feet of water during the storm. Damage

621 Water St., Manhattan
This 124-unit supportive housing rental building sustained damage to floors, ceilings, electrical equipment, radiators, pumps, and the trash compactor. The building's commercialgrade kitchen, used to prepare meals for residents, was also destroyed by the storm. Work has been contracted and is scheduled to be completed by early 2014. Reimbursement for
this work is proposed.

2675 West 36th Street, Brooklyn

Public Explanation of a Proposed Activity in the 100Year Floodplain:

The City of New York has carried out the procedures required by Executive Order 11988 on Flood Plain Management including the consideration of a no-action alternative, to avoid adverse effects and incompatible development in the floodplain. A no-action alternative would not achieve the City's goals of restoring the health and safety f hurricane-danag it proming and impleng for its rilien pures to mitigate damage from future resilience measures to mitigate damage from future weather their homes located in the floodplain, live in damaged unsafe, and unsanitary housing within the hurricane damaged neighborhoods or seek shelter elsewhere. Poor structural integrity of hurricane-damaged buildings within the floodplain would put residents at a greater risk should a flood event occur, especially if buildings do not meet current elevation requirements. Storm debris fields on the properties of residential buildings would potentially remain unaddressed, also posing a threat to public health and water quality.

The City has considered alternatives and mitigation measures to be taken to minimize adverse impacts and to floodplain It therefore proposes to support the prof floodplain. It therefore proposes to support the projects projects totally outside the floodplain. To minimize potentia harm to the floodplain, HPD will require that the projects implement the following mitigation measures:

1) Property owners will be required to purchase and maintain flood insurance for the life of the property or the term of federal assistance; and
2) All alterations and repair work must comply with he NYC Department of Buildings requirements for lood-resistant construction (Appendix G of the measures described above will be implemented as practicable.
