

CAPTAIN (FIRE)

General Statement of Duties and Responsibilities

Under general direction, is responsible for the command and control of a company; performs related work.

Example of Typical Tasks

Commands and assumes responsibility for the efficient operation of a company.

Is responsible for the discipline of members in their command and the maintenance and protection of all department property in or assigned to the unit.

Performs all other duties prescribed for this position in the regulations of the department.

Drives a motor vehicle.

Qualification Requirements

1. One (1) year of permanent service in the title of Lieutenant (Fire) or Supervising Fire Marshall (Uniformed); and
2. Eighty semester credits from an accredited college. Non-collegiate training programs that are offered by various organizations, including the Fire Department, may be acceptable as educational equivalents of college credits if the programs have been evaluated by the Program on Non-Collegiate Sponsored Instruction ("PONSI") or the American Council of Education ("ACE"), and recommended for college credit.

License Requirement

At the time of appointment, all candidates must possess a Motor Vehicle Driver License valid in the State of New York. This license must be maintained for the duration of employment.
