

## Wildlife Rehabilitation in New York City

To rehabilitate wild animals in New York State, you need to <u>secure a wildlife rehabilitator</u>
<u>license</u> from the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation. **Within New York City, there are additional requirements for engaging in rehabilitation work:** 

- You must keep the wild animal at one of these venues:
  - a zoological park or aquarium operated by the Department of Parks and Recreation,
     Wildlife Conservation Society or Staten Island Zoological Society
  - a veterinary hospital or other veterinary or medical facility where veterinary care is provided for such animals
  - If you wish to use an alternative venue, you must first receive permission from the Health Department by emailing <u>veterinaryhealth@health.nyc.gov</u>.
- If bitten by the wild animal, you must report the bite to the New York City Health Department by calling 311.

Also, if you have a wildlife rehabilitator license and want to exhibit or display wildlife, including for educational purposes, you must first <u>obtain an exhibition permit</u> from the New York City Health Department.
