Started in 2012, the John D. Solomon Fellowship for Public Service is the first graduate fellowship in New York City devoted specifically to emergency management. The competitive paid program attracts applicants from a wide variety of prestigious graduate programs.

John was an accomplished journalist on homeland security and a devoted public servant. 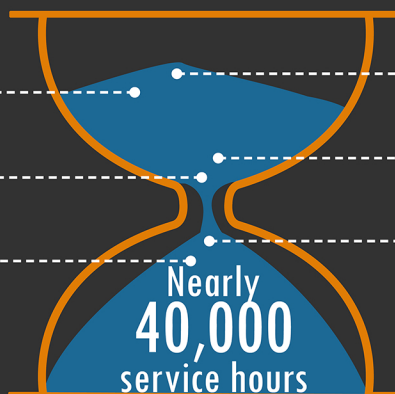
