Notes from Frances Pardus-Abbadessa, Executive Deputy Commissioner HRA/OCSE:

OCSE Received \$57,551,041 in total collections for the month of February 2017 (a four week month). The average collections in February increased by 3% compared to January 2017. While the collections for Never and Current for CYTD 17 are down and YTD are down, this is largely explained by there being 8 weeks in 2017 compared to 9 weeks in 2016. We do not believe this is an indication of a real decline in collections.

⁽¹⁾ This measure includes actively charging and arrears only cases. However, if we consider only actively charging cases (cases with an ongoing obligation) the Total Cases with a Collection percentage remains stable at 59% this month.

⁽²⁾ We continue to observe the effects of ongoing cleanup projects aiming at closing account level cases that are appropriate for closure. This contributes to the large decrease in Current Support Due and in the percentage of "Current Distributed – Former."

⁽³⁾ The State carried out a one-time clean up project in 2012 with the Department of Health to identify cases that received Medicaid at any time and moved the collection data from Never to Former, leaving the cases in place.
