

New York City Office of Child Support Services (OCSS) Programs to Assist Noncustodial Parents

The New York City Human Resources Administration (HRA) Office of Child Support Services (OCSS) is a federally mandated program to support children. OCSS lifts thousands of children out of poverty and prides itself on the many programs available for parents.

DEBT REDUCTION PROGRAMS

OCSS understands that debt from any source can have a negative impact on an individual's mental and physical health. Research suggests that it can also affect whole families. Through debt reduction programs, OCSS can reduce arrears (debt) owed permanently to the NYC Department of Social Services (DSS). Since 2009, OCSS reduced close to \$274 million in debt owed to the NYC Department of Social Services (DSS) through the below programs.

- Caps arrears at \$500 when the noncustodial parent (NCP) earns at or below the Federal Poverty Level.

- \$5,000 annual credit when child support is paid in full for a year. Receives up to a \$15,000 credit over 3 years or up to the amount of debt owed to DSS.

- Reduce up to \$7,500 in DSS arrears by completing a substance use treatment program or getting and keeping a new job through a DSS Employment Program.



- Make a payment – reduce your DSS debt by double.
- Pay off the principal on your money judgment payable to NYC DSS and your interest will be removed.

- Past-due child support payments owed to the custodial parent
- Future child support payments
- Child support agreements
- Communication on parenting issues
- Custody or visitation
- Other types of conflicts

Order Modification Agreements

NCPs can receive help with modifying a child support court order with the assistance of an OCSS Customer Service staff. Learn more by emailing dcse.cseweb@dfa.state.ny.us with subject "Agreement" or learn more at <https://bit.ly/changeyourorder>.



- Supportive and friendly approach to modifying a child support order.
- Designed to take less time than the traditional court process. A court hearing is still required to obtain an order on consent.
- OCSS helps NCPs fill out the required paperwork.
- The custodial parent needs to participate if they are not receiving cash assistance.
