



SENIOR RESOURCES IN COMMUNITY DISTRICT I




LMDC SMALL FIRM ASSISTANCE PROGRAM: PAST ELIGIBLE STREETS*




SMALL FIRM BUSINESS STUDY: STUDY AREA





Conclusion

- Plazas built under the original zoning bonus program scored lowest in superior design features such as compliance with:
 - Openness
 - Access
 - Safety
 - Seating
- Conversely, plazas built after improved design requirements were in place (mostly along Water Street) scored higher in meeting superior design criteria and compliance with signage regulation
- Generally, very few plazas lend themselves to occupancy by public advocacy groups because of their limited size and public access
